Lutherans and Lent

Lent is the forty-six days before Easter when Christian believers prepare for Easter through prayer, doing penance, mortifying the flesh, repentance of sins, almsgiving, and self-restraint and abstention. While in excess of a billion Christians observe Lent, not all Christians do. It is observed by Anglicans, Roman Catholics, Eastern Orthodox, Lutherans, and Methodists. The scriptural impetus for Lent is the forty days that Jesus spent in the wilderness after his baptism.

Not eating meat during Lent is an obligatory Sacred Tradition for Catholics. For Lutherans, who do not hold anything holy outside of Scripture, the season of Lent is observed, but fasting and penance are not viewed as compulsory. Catholics often refrain from eating meat on Friday during Lent, but this is not common among Lutherans.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. On this day, Christians receive repentance ashes on their foreheads to either the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or the dictum, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ash Wednesday derives its name from this practice.

Holy Week is the week leading up to the important Christian festival of Easter. Holy week begins on Palm Sunday, and includes Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and ends on Holy Saturday.

Maundy Thursday, also known as Holy Thursday, is a Christian observance in the United States. It commemorates the Last Supper, when Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and established the ceremony known as the Eucharist. The night of Maundy Thursday is the night Jesus was betrayed by Judas in the Garden of Gethsemane. The word "Maundy" comes to us as an Anglo-French word derived from the Latin "mandatum," which means "commandment."

Good Friday is observed as the day when Jesus was put to death by crucifixion at Calvary. Christians believe Jesus died for their sins, and Lutherans observe Good Friday as a day of self-examination. As part of the liturgy of the Three Days, many Christian denominations, including the Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Lutheran, Anglican, Methodist, Oriental Orthodox, and Reformed traditions, observe Good Friday with fasting and church services. However, if a Lutheran chooses to fast on Good Friday, it is a personal choice and not a mandate of the church.

Tina Bigelow was elected to the executive board of Women of the ELCA in July 2017. She serves as chair of the programs and communication committee.

Tina was president of the Southwestern Washington Synodical Women's Organization (1C) when she was elected to serve on the executive board. Previously, she was vice president of the Southwestern Washington SWO. She was a voting member at the 2014 and 2017 triennial conventions, serving on the resolutions committee in 2014.

Tina served on the organizing committee for the 2016 Region One Gathering and she chaired the planning committee for the 2017 Conference of Presidents.

A resident of Poulsbo, Wash., Tina is active with Women of Vinland at Vinland Lutheran Church, Poulsbo. She has served Vinland Lutheran as youth mission trip chaperone and on the preschool board, altar guild and communion team. She represented Vinland as a voting member for the 2015 synod assembly.

A U.S. Navy veteran, she retired in 2005, serving as a defense contractor until 2007. She holds a bachelor's degree in engineering and a master's degree in IT management.

During her Navy career, she volunteered with grade school support programs in the United States and orphanage work overseas. Since, she is a regular volunteer with schools, serving as an inclass tutor and offering staff support.

Tina advocates for homeless youth in her area. As a disabled veteran and cancer survivor, she also volunteers with organizations such as Susan G. Komen, American Cancer Society, Disabled Veterans of America, and Wounded Warriors that support those groups.

Impact of COVID-19 pandemic on the functioning of WELCA

Below is an excerpt from a memo received from Linda Post Bushkofsy, executive director 26 March 2020

Greetings in the name of the one who creates, redeems and sustains us all.

I send this to you in the midst of these challenging and disruptive times. Winston Churchill is quoted as saying, "Sometimes it is not enough to do our best; we must do what is required." Much will be required of us in the coming months as leaders of this organization, and with the

information in this memo, I seek to equip you for that work.

CHURCHWIDE EXECUTIVE BOARD TO MEET VIRTUALLY

The April meeting of the churchwide executive board will not occur in-person. Instead, the board will be meeting on Saturday, April 25, via a Zoom meeting.

TRIENNIAL CONVENTION AND GATHERING

You are likely fielding questions about the triennial convention and gathering, scheduled for July in Phoenix.

Allow me to offer some background information before describing the current thinking.

- * As you know, our life together is controlled in a significant part by our constitutions. **There is no constitutional authority for a virtual convention.**
- * The executive board has the constitutional authority to set the date and time of the convention and therefore has the presumed authority to postpone or reschedule a convention.
- * The board, which also sets the date and time of the gathering, would have the authority to postpone the gathering.

FINANCIAL REALITIES

If women are not meeting in congregational units, at conference or cluster events or at synodical conventions, **in-person offerings are not being collected, and Regular Offerings and**Thankofferings are not flowing to the churchwide organization. Without those offerings, little revenue supports the budget of the churchwide organization, and the churchwide organization has few reserves upon which to draw. It is as simple as that.

DAY-TO-DAY MANAGEMENT OF THE ORGANIZATION

Staff is continuing their work at home. The transition from working in the Lutheran Center and working at home has gone well. We have all the equipment we need to function fully. The governor of Illinois issued a stay-at-home order that became effective this past Saturday. **Only essential personnel are now permitted into the Lutheran Center.** For Women of the ELCA, that is Elizabeth Hunter and me. One of us will go to the Lutheran Center once each week to handle mail and any other matters requiring in-person attention. At this point (and this is always subject to change), staff at the Lutheran Center will be **working remotely through April 20**. Rest assured that the day-to-day work of the churchwide women's organization is functioning smoothly. Programmatic work continues, with a new emphasis on sustaining community, which is at our core, in this time of physical distancing.

IN CONCLUSION

I invite you to pray regarding all these matters as we live into this new reality.

May the peace of God, that surpasses all understanding, keep our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.
