

That person as well as any of the officers are there to assist you in many ways. For one thing, they are a good person to call when you are looking for resources. And if they don't know something right away, they will find out and get back to you. They may contact you before you contact them. They are encouraged to come and visit with you. So, be thinking about this and when you would like them to come.

Recently I attended a meeting at the Synod Learning Center in Santa Ana. It brought together people who were interested in learning and thinking about all the violence we have in our society today. This is not just a one time item to talk about and then we have "done" something. This is an ongoing topic that all of us need to be in discussion about. Talk about it at your unit meetings, council meetings, youth meetings, or wherever you have a chance to bring it up. The group will gather on January 18th in the hopes of coming up with definite plans to give the ELCA a voice within our communities.

A good thing to subscribe to on the internet in "News from the Women of the ELCA". You will find out what our group is all about doing and some ideas for your own group.

We have a lot of things the Women are doing around the Synod. Check the calendar of activities in this and every issue of the Pacifica Partners.



If we've heard and read it once, we've heard and read many times that the mission of Women of the ELCA "is to mobilize women to act boldly on their faith in Jesus Christ."

One single day spent at a Triennial Convention will convince you forever that yes, at the churchwide level our organization is rich in the opportunities it provides for service, study and advocacy*. And, from the perspective of the board of the Pacifica Synodical Women's Organization (SWO), we too work to provide opportunities to mobilize you to *act boldly*. From experience, we know you are always ready for new opportunities just by the way you enthusiastically keep coming to events and by the way you always are so generous with love gifts when called upon.

Sometimes, though, the best ideas for acting boldly aren't the board-programmed ones. Sometimes the best ideas come from YOU!

Let me digress. Every year when we have our annual gathering/business meeting in November, there's an opportunity for YOU to present resolutions for consideration by the SWO. Recalling a little bit of parliamentary procedure, a *resolution* is the way that you, our members, can bring to the rest of us a request for action on something that's important to you. If you bring a resolution and the others agree that it's important by voting to adopt (approve) it, then it becomes a course of action for us to follow. Said another way, a resolution is a "grass roots" kind of thing—it's members making a call for action instead of waiting for a board to hopefully one day think up the idea.

That's exactly what happened last November on the final day of our meeting in San Diego—a resolution was presented and adopted that calls Pacifica women to bold new action in a way that will in turn mobilize other women to act boldly on their faith! Why would we take such an action? From the "Whereas" part of the resolution (and substituting "Because" to make it more readable), these are the reasons we agreed upon:

- Because Pacifica Women of the ELCA are in full support of the ordination of women, and
- Because we have nurtured, mentored and prayed a number of our own Pacifica women to this end, and
- Because a woman's journey toward ordination requires not only a heart for answering God's call, but the financial means for the eight or so years of college and seminary education, and
- Because it is likely that women who embark on this journey have limited financial resources and huge expenses.

And, from the "Resolved" part (i.e. the action part) of the resolution, this is what we agreed should be done:

- That Pacifica Women of the ELCA continue to prayerfully nurture, mentor and support the women in our synod who feel that God is calling them to ordained ministry, and
- That Pacifica Women of the ELCA establish a scholarship fund for women whose home ELCA congregations are in the Pacifica Synod, and
- That the Pacifica Women of the ELCA synodical board explore, activate, promote and administer said scholarship by our 2013 synodical convention.

This year, the board has been working on plans to put the scholarship in place, and at our November convention in Ontario we'll present the plan to you and launch some fun fundraising ideas. We hope you'll be as excited as we are about having a part in "growing a pastor" from among our Pacifica congregations.

And that, dear sisters, is a beautiful picture of YOUR ideas on ways we can mobilize other women so that all are acting boldly on their faith in Jesus Christ! Keep the ideas coming!


Our own then, Swo Board member, Paula Rennegarbe, retired AiM, led us in an fact learning, inspirational and amazing Bible Study Friday evening.
