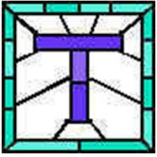

Days of Transition-Defined by Renewal and Resurrection



here is an interesting category of hymns in the Evangelical Lutheran Worship book called "Time After Epiphany." Hymns 304 through 318 are found in that section. As the ELCA Conference of Bishops meets in Itasca, Illinois these last days of Epiphany through Shrove Tuesday, it is those hymns that we are singing in our daily services of Word and Sacrament.

We Christians are in a transitional time between two extraordinary seasons of the church and its calendar. The long days of Epiphany Light and Joy are ending and the powerful drama and passion of the 40 days of Lent are about to unfold again. It is also in these days that we transition from the longer, colder nights of winter to the warmer, lengthier days of spring. Change, transition, transformation, conversion, renewal are in the air and all around us, seasonally and in the life and times of the Church.

Our Presiding Bishop was thanking the people of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) as he told us what happened in January while he was waiting for a plane in Los Angeles. A woman noticed his clergy shirt, collar and cross and asked "What kind of a bishop are you, Episcopalian?" Bishop Hanson said, "I'm Lutheran." And the woman literally shouted, "We love Lutherans!" Our Bishop asked, "Who is the 'we'?" She said, "I work for FEMA. We love the Lutherans, because in the face of disaster, you not only show up, but you stay until the work is done."



"...the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.' ~Revelation 21:5

Then our Presiding Bishop Mark S. Hanson told us another story. He has just returned from a second visit to Haiti and he returned with pictures of rubble and rebuilding, of pain and problems, of hope and help, of people and promise. He spoke of the tremendous work Louis Dorvillier, Director of ELCA International Development and Disaster Response, is doing there on our behalf. Louis, formerly a member of St. Andrew's in Whittier, is leading the efforts for the ELCA and Lutheran World Federation on our behalf in his homeland. Bishop Hanson showed us pictures of rebuilding and the forward strides being made by the people there, but he also showed us how much rubble still is piled high right where it reduced great buildings to heaps of ruin on January 12, 2010. He thanked us and asked us to thank the church for its great outpouring of generosity that has allowed the ELCA to send and spend millions of dollars already and to continue this work for many more months and years to come in this devastated land. The ELCA will stay in Haiti.

Bishop Hanson told us about Renee Splichal Larson returning to the site where she and her husband, Ben, were serving and spending the J-Term of their fourth year of seminary education. They were teaching theology and living in the St. Joseph Home for Boys in Port-au-Prince. When the earthquake destroyed the building, Renee and her husband's cousin (another seminarian) somehow were able to crawl out of the wreckage, but Ben was trapped and died under the collapsing concrete rubble. Bishop Hanson told us how the Lutheran Church members in that rebuilding city came together and sang the hymn that Renee heard Ben singing as he breathed his last breaths of earthly life. At a place of death, it was a sign of resurrection.

Next Bishop Hanson told us what the Rev. Joseph Livenson Lauvanus, president of the Eglise Lutherienne d'Haiti (The Lutheran Church of Haiti), said to him. "We Haitians," said Pastor Lauvanus, "will not be defined by the rubble, but by restoration, for we are a people of the resurrection." He showed Bishop Hanson where some of the great energy and work and where some of the \$12.6 million dollars of ELCA generosity is restoring his country and bringing signs of new life and resurrection.

Bishop Hanson made reference to the last several years of our life together in the ELCA and I repeat those thoughts and words for the Pacifica Synod. We have experienced some major setbacks by the response to decisions made by this church in the past several years. We are reeling in many places from the downturn of our global, national and local economies. Faith communities everywhere are experiencing the cultural shift away from the institutional church. There certainly is some residue and rubble from all of those realities converging upon us at the same time. But here is our word of hope in the midst of it all...



the church of which we are a part "will not be defined by the rubble, but by restoration, for we are a people of the resurrection." As the Pacifica Synod has begun its work of re-visioning, re-shaping, renewal and resurrection, just as other synods and the churchwide expression are doing the same, we look with anticipation and hope to tomorrow and the days ahead. Centered in Christ, grounded in Holy Scripture, nurtured by water, bread, and wine, and sent forth and out by the very Breath of God into a world so in need of the unlimited love and compassion of Jesus, we move forward as resurrection people with hope and promise. The past is the past and now we embrace the future with the call and will of God for today and tomorrow, guiding us and giving us courage to be renewed each day.

Thank you, people of Pacifica, for being first and foremost a people of resurrection!

Quilt Challenge (for more information, go to www.womenoftheelca.org/triennialgathering)

Make a quilt interpreting the theme, Renew, Respond, Rejoice! The challenge comes not only in interpreting the theme but also in working within certain rules. The quilt must interpret the gathering theme, Renew, Respond, Rejoice!

1. Finished size of the quilt must be 40 inches square.
2. Traditional or original patterns may be used. Credit must be given when using the pattern or design of another.
3. Quilts may be pieced or appliquéd or a combination. They may include surface embellishment techniques (e.g., dying, trapunto, stenciling, whole cloth, embroidery, batik, painting, embossing, etc.).
4. Each quilt must be quilted, not tied. Both machine quilting and hand quilting are acceptable.
5. Each quilt must have a sleeve attached to the top back for hanging. The sleeve opening must be 4 inches wide after it is attached to the quilt and must be attached in a way that it will not show when the quilt is hanging.
6. A fabric identification label must be securely sewn to a bottom back corner of the quilt (a paper label pinned to the quilt is not acceptable) with the name, address and telephone number of the entrant.
7. The challenge is open to all women who are members of ELCA congregations. The quilt must be the work of a single individual; no group or two-person quilts will be accepted. Quilt(s) must be constructed and quilted by the person named on the entry blank. The quilter need not be planning to attend the 2011 Triennial Gathering in order to participate in the quilt challenge.
8. Limit of 2 entries per person. Entry fee is \$5 which includes return shipping. Quilts may be picked up on site with proper identification at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, July 16, 2011, in the exhibit hall. If you are unable to pick up your quilt(s), you must notify Women of the ELCA in writing with the name of the person picking it up; that person must also show identification. Those quilts not picked up will be shipped to the entrant following the gathering.

All quilts must be received in the churchwide office by May 1, 2011, along with a completed entry form. [Download and print the entry form](#). Mail quilts to: Women of the ELCA Quilt Challenge, 8765 W Higgins Road, Chicago IL 60631.

GIRLS' NIGHT OUT

FEATURING DONNA EAST "A Time To Laugh"

Donna East is known as New York City's Christian Comedian and labeled by a local paper the Queen of Clean. Born and raised in a suburb of Detroit, events in East's childhood developed a sense of low self-esteem. "I found out I didn't fit in. I felt different. I felt Lonely. I felt like an outcast." (Romans 8:23) At 8 years old, she invited Jesus in her heart during a children's church service. She knew at such a young age God had a plan for her life. (Jeremiah 29:11) After moving to NYC to follow her dream of acting, East began working in comedy clubs. Then after a traumatic experience on 9-11 in New York City, Donna suffered two grand mal seizures and was diagnosed with epilepsy. (Deuteronomy 31:8 "The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged.") Later, when she was pregnant with her first child, the doctors asked her to terminate because of the risks of the effects of seizure medication to the baby. East explained to the doctors that she was a Christian, that God was in control and HE HIMSELF would give her wisdom, courage and the strength to care for her baby. Her baby was born perfectly healthy and A GIFT FROM GOD! Since then, her pregnancy has helped doctors to discover that women with epilepsy can have healthy babies. "There is nothing that brings me more joy than sitting in the presence of God and worshipping HIM. His touch brings so much power and healing. God has even shown me in His word that we can laugh again!" (Proverb 17:22, 15:15) Even Sarah laughed! Come and bring your friends to hear Donna's story firsthand for a night of real inspiration and fun!

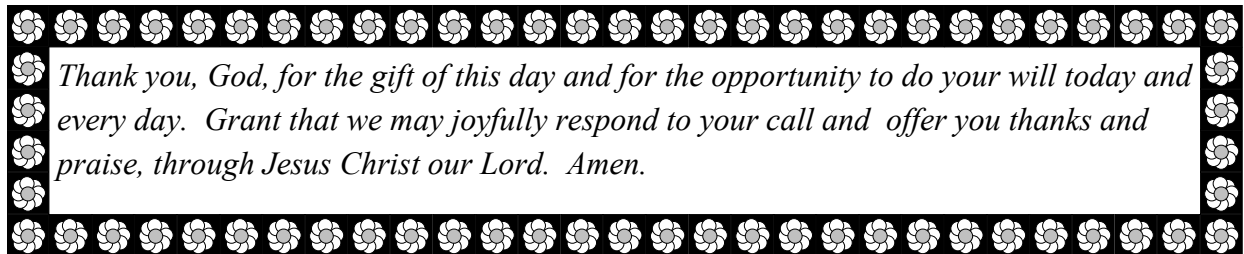
