March 6th – “Called to Love as God Loves – Unconditionally” will happen very soon as I write this, but it will be history when you receive this issue. So it is time to turn your attention to our bi-annual convention November 5-7, 2010. Our board just met and began the planning process. Many more details will be forthcoming as they become reality. Meanwhile, let me share what we have in mind to date.

“Best Friends – Devoted to God, the World, and One Another” is our theme. Romans 12: 10-11 is our theme verse – “Love one another....Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord.” At the moment not lagging in zeal and being ardent in spirit will relate to discipleship. Serving the Lord will relate to hands on serving – something where you can sweat and get dirty. Last November when we went to the Ronald McDonald House, we opted not to do “chores” where we might get sweaty and dirty because it was a one day event and we had no place to shower or freshen up for the closing banquet. This November we will have the Marriott within a block of King of Glory in Fountain Valley where we will meet for the weekend. We are hoping to work on a Thrivent Build but we don’t know yet if that will be possible. Of course we will have some alternative hands on serving that will be less strenuous. Also, possibly a couple workshop choices not necessarily directly related to serving but to other parts of our theme. So a warning that you won’t be able to do it ALL! You will need to make some choices.

You may remember that I like to toss up the schedule and not always do things at the same time as “we’ve always done it”. But at the moment we have not brainstormed the schedule. That will come as we get other pieces in place. A bit opposite from last convention where we did begin with a tossed up schedule plan and then put the pieces in place. We have issued a couple invitations for chaplain and Bible study leader.

From chats with some of you and notes from others, many of our units are struggling to feel like they are units still. While our units may no longer look like they did say fifteen years ago, there is no reason to feel your unit no longer exists. Our organization is all about ministry by women for women and children. That can take many forms and those forms can be changing. Change can be *good*!! If you are meeting regularly doing ministry in some way and/or Bible study, give of financial resources in some way, participate in some way beyond your congregation, and have at least a contact person, your unit exists! A year ago I prepared a power point that addressed many questions regarding our units. I still would be happy to come to any of your units, but someone raised the question whether it could be a workshop this November. Of course it could. Again, we have many details to work through yet, but if any of you would like to email me to express an interest in this type of workshop, we will find a way to do it.

In this issue there is a scholarship application. Note the deadline and also note that two of the three scholarships are for first time scholarship recipients- not necessarily first time attendees.

As I mentioned in January, we will be electing four triennial delegates – but these must be nominated by a unit. So plan who you want to nominate from your unit and then fill out the form that is elsewhere in this newsletter. Plus if you have any suggestions for board members and secretary and treasurer – or want to volunteer(!) – use the form in this issue. Note you do not have to ask that person first, the nominating team will do that.

As an organization we are separately incorporated but we are in full partnership with the whole church. So I’d also like to raise up our Synod Assembly being held May 6-8 at the Town & Country Resort in San Diego under the theme, “Together in Christ”. Our presiding Bishop Mark Hansen will be in attendance and will be preaching at a worship service and speaking at the Friday night meal. Friday servant events much like we are planning for our November convention, will happen. During the meal and program time there will be a focus on several mission happenings. If you are not coming as a delegate, you still may attend as a visitor. And you can come for a day for only \$10. If you choose to come for Friday and want to include the evening meal, it will be just \$50 and well worth it! I know, because I have a little something to do with it! We also will have a display table there. Visit www.pacificasynod.org for more details.

Then in between our March event and Synod Assembly you can also spend a Saturday morning at a Cluster Event. Be sure to note the calendar in this issue for those dates, times, and places.

I would also like to put out a call for someone interested in being a “new fashioned” historian. We have some scrapbooks of pictures from years past with a couple newer ones done by a “Creative Memories” artist. But we have a lot of digital pictures on CDs from recent years that could really use some time and interest to put them in electronic albums. Interested or know someone who would be interested? We closed out this faith filled day with Worship led by Pastor Karen Mahron in the Christ Lutheran Sanctuary. This is a beautiful place of worship themed around the water of life.
