Pastor Judi Miller to give Wrap-Up Bible Study on November 7th

Pastor Judi Miller is one of the pastors of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Fullerton, CA. having arrived from Texas to begin her ministry there in March of 2003. Natives of Ohio, this was her and husband Jim's third move to California! Pastor Judi graduated from California State University, Long Beach with a Bachelor's degree in History and an elementary teaching certificate. After many years of lay involvement and professional work in congregational youth ministry, Pastor Judi studied at Perkins School of Theology at SMU in Dallas, Texas and Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio from which she received her Master of Divinity degree in 1991. Following a yearlong residency in Clinical Pastoral Education at Methodist Hospitals of Dallas, Pastor Judi accepted a call to St. Paul Lutheran Church in New Braunfels, TX and was ordained in December of 1992. Her only



child Josh and his wife Rachel have made Pastor Judi the proud "Gamma" to Cameron (6) and Olivia (4) who live in Houston, TX.

"Bad Girls of the Bible" is an interactive study and "look" at several women of the Scriptures based on the book (and terribly interesting!) and Bible Study series written by Liz Curtiss Higgs. 



It's cold, windy and snowy or rainy, maybe I'll just stay home from church this morning. They won't miss me.

What a long day, the weather really wasn't all that bad. I could have gone to church. I wonder what the choir sang this morning. I missed Pastor's good sermon. Who's the biggest loser?

I'm so tired tonight, I don't think I'll go to the W-ELCA (or circle) meeting. I'll just relax and watch TV....

Sure wasn't anything good on TV. I miss my circle family, and "Ann" always does the best Bible study. I can read my *Lutheran Woman Today*, but it isn't the same as being there. Bet they had a good lunch too. Who's the biggest loser?

- 14. K.M.S. (Keep Mouth Shut).. This single piece of advice can prevent an enormous amount of trouble.
- 15. Do something for the Kid in You everyday.
- 16. Carry a book of scriptures with you to read while waiting in line.
- 17. Get enough rest.
- 18. Eat right.
- 19 Get organized so everything has its place.
- 20. Listen to a tape while driving that can help improve your quality of life.
- 21. Write down thoughts and inspirations.
- 22. Every day, find time to be alone.
- 23. Having problems? Talk to God on the spot. Try to nip small problems in the bud. Don't wait until it's time to go to bed to try and pray.
- 24. Make friends with Godly people.
- 25. Keep a folder of favorite scriptures on hand.
- 26. Remember that the shortest bridge between despair and hope is often a good 'Thank you Lord
- 27. Laugh.
- 28. Laugh some more!
- 29. Take your work seriously, but not yourself at all.
- 30. Develop a forgiving attitude (most people are doing the best they can).
- 31. Be kind to unkind people (they probably need it the most).
- 32. Sit on your ego.
- 33 Talk less; listen more.
- 34. Slow down..
- 35. Remind yourself that you are not the general manager of the universe.
