And your Pacifica Women of the ELCA board will continue to work to bring these day events to you on the first Saturday in March and the first Saturday in November. Mark your personal calendars and mark your church calendars so we don't have conflicting events. Personally invite more women, specific women – there are so many more who have not experienced what we are really all about and how that can make a difference in their lives and in their serving.

November 7th is the day. We are planning a day very different from yesterday though worship and fellowship will be a part. The very basic schedule will begin with worship, move to a convention without walls/servant event, and close with an early banquet. It will be in the Inland Empire and we are exploring ideas in the Redlands area or the San Bernardino area. We are planning to work closely with our very young women especially with the servant event. And we will have fun with perhaps some surprises in learning from and about each other.

Yesterday we also began what I hope will be an ongoing process of sharing who we are and what we do as

congregational units. As I mentioned last month, our executive director is on sabbatical and is gathering a history of our organization and collecting stories from units. When she emailed me asking for units in our area that she might visit, I realized I really did not know your unit stories. Furthermore, I realized that in sharing these stories, units that feel they are struggling may gain new ideas and insight and know that they are not alone but neither are they powerless and can in fact become revitalized. Several women filled out the form I provided yesterday and handed it back to me. Thank you!! Included in this newsletter is the form with the basic questions – download it either from the newsletter or our web site and type as much or as little as you would like, to answer the question of what your unit is about. Again it can be mailed or emailed.

Give me a little more time to compile the ones I have received – but I will find a way to begin sharing and keep on sharing these ideas. It may be part of this newsletter and/or a separate section of the newsletter. And we likely will place them in a separate section on the web site as well. And if you see your unit highlighted, don't think you cannot share again. Try something and let us know what you tried and how it worked.

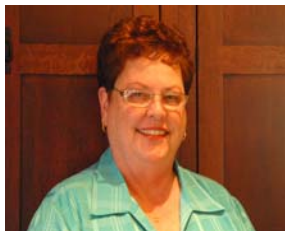

Since the fiscal year for Pacifica Women of the ELCA ended January 31, 2009, I would like to report how well we did this past year. **I would personally like to THANK all those Congregational Units that provided support** so that we can keep pace with our budget. In reference to our Benevolence giving, highlights are that **We** have contributed \$7852.83 (50%) of \$14562.94 of our Unit Offerings, \$625.03 of cluster events, \$2591.64 of Convention Offerings and \$3000.00 for our Triennial Offering to the Churchwide Organization-Women of the ELCA which is in Chicago. This enables them to support their churchwide ministries. In addition, your Pacifica SWO Board at their February board meeting voted to send an additional \$1500.00 offering to Women of the ELCA.

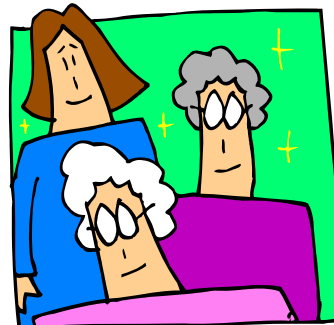

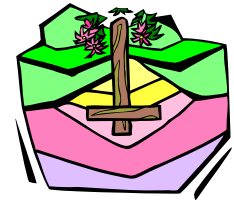
