## From the President's Desk



**It is now official** – we have cancelled our Convention and Gathering scheduled for November 6-7. We will meet again November 5-6, 2021. Back in March when COVID-19 became a pandemic, November seemed such a long way off and surely things would change by then. As you all know, it has been a roller coaster ride! San Diego area has been getting better and maybe in November we would be allowed to meet in larger groups, yet it is too uncertain and we have too many women that likely will not feel comfortable, even if technically it is allowed.

Our board considered postponing until March 2021, rather than

"cancelling." In the end we decided it is still best to cancel until November 2021. Which means that all board members will carry over one more year. A term ending in 2020 will now end in 2021 and a term that was to end in 2021 will now end in 2022. That way we will stay on track for staggered terms.

We do have exciting news to share!!We are planning to hold a Zoom event called "Celebrating Women" on November 7th in place of our cancelled event. Our speaker, Pastor Jean Bozeman, is eager and excited to participate in a Zoom event. Pastor Patrice has been speaking and working with her for several months and we don't want to miss out!

At this point we are thinking the event will begin at 1 pm Pacific Time. Not sure how long yet, perhaps two – three hours. Pastor Jean won't be the only active participant. And we are hoping to include music – if you have an idea for a music video which you could send, please let us know.

The link to the event will be sent by email from our website. We plan to research/check on best possible way/s to use technology. By November, we perhaps can meet in small groups. So someone with a computer and ability to use Zoom may invite a few others from same congregation or circle or Bible Study group and participate in the event together. One idea is to unmute such a group one at a time and have each introduce which church you are from.

If this event goes well, the idea is to do another in perhaps January. Then we'll see by March whether that will also be via Zoom or if we can gather in person once again.

## **Dear Friend in Christ**

Want to sustain the community that is a hallmark of Women of the ELCA? Then join Dear Friend in Christ, a unique letter-exchange project to which all participants are invited.

#### How does it work?

1. Write a letter. Use the "Dear Friend in Christ" salutation. Fill a page or two, however you are inspired. Among other things, please share your thoughts on these questions: How is your faith in Jesus Christ sustaining you during the global pandemic? What words of encouragement can you offer the person who receives your letter?

- 2. You can handwrite or type the letter.
- 3. You could include a drawing, a photo, or a recipe, anything that fits into an envelope.
- 4. Offer up a prayer for the recipient.
- 5. You may include your mailing address in the letter if you do not wish to remain anonymous.

6. Print and sign the Dear Friend in Christ release form. If you don't have access to a printer, please use our online form. We cannot exchange letters without a release.

7. Mail your letter and signed release form to Dear Friend in Christ, Women of the ELCA, 8765 W Higgins Road, Chicago IL 60631. **Deadline for mailing letters to the churchwide organization is October 15, 2020.** 

#### What else do I need to know?

1. When you write to Dear Friend in Christ, your letter will be swapped with a letter from another writer. They will get your letter; you will get their letter. The exchange is anonymous (unless you provide your contact information), so you can share as little or as much information about yourself as you like.

2. Dear Friend in Christ is open to all participants, although **writers under 18 must have parental consent**. Download the release form.

3. Letters are paired at random, and we will try to match participants with someone in a different geographical part of the ELCA. Women of the ELCA staff read all letters before the exchange happens.

4. Letters will be mailed to participants on a rolling basis, beginning in June 2020. We will continue exchanging letters received through All Saints Day, November 1, 2020.

Churchwide Women of the ELCA Updates...

By now, you have probably heard that the Churchwide Executive Board postponed the Eleventh Triennial Convention and Gathering at their April 2020 virtual board meeting.

"We are postponing not canceling," said Linda Post Bushkofsky, executive director of Women of the ELCA.

The Eleventh Triennial Convention is rescheduled for August 3-5, 2021. And the "Just Love" Gathering, is rescheduled for August 5-8, 2021. So mark those calendars and let's see lots of Nebraskans in attendance.

Postponing the convention means that the current executive board will serve another year until "replacements are elected and installed," Bushkofsky said. Then, the board elected in 2021 will serve a two-year term.

For the 2023 convention, "we would be back to our three-year cycle. That works best with the churchwide assembly, the youth gathering, and the rostered leaders' event."

# Congregational units should use caution when planning events

The churchwide executive board of Women of the ELCA strongly encourages congregational units to carefully monitor current federal, state, and local governmental orders and recommendations in light of the COVID-19 pandemic, along with the recommendations of their synod.

All caution should be taken to protect the health of participants and their families. Where appropriate, postponing or canceling in-person events may be necessary. If in-person gatherings are being considered, the pastor and congregational council should be consulted.

Congregational units are encouraged to explore virtual opportunities for gathering, and the churchwide staff stand ready to consult on ways to gather virtually.

The churchwide executive board previously encouraged all synodical organizations, conferences, and clusters to postpone or cancel all in-person events through the end of 2020.
