	Questions	True	False
1.	If you are moving, the forks should be kept 2-4" from the floor or just high enough to clear any obstructions on the floor.		
2.	Raising the load while traveling or turning is the proper approach for placing the load on the rack.		
3.	You should make certain that the rear trailer/truck wheels are chocked before loading or unloading a trailer.		
4.	Only trained and authorized operators are permitted to operate a powered industrial truck.		
5.	Under certain conditions, employees are permitted to walk or work under elevated forks or loads.		
6.	If the forklift begins to tip over, you should remain inside the lift and not try to jump clear.		
7.	It is O.K. to pass another truck at an intersection as long as you sound your horn.		
8.	If the load blocks your view, you must travel in reverse.		
9.	When going up or down a ramp, you must have the load uphill.		
10.	Operators are required to inspect their forklift daily.		
11.	Since lift trucks are very heavy, you <u>do not</u> have to slow down for wet and slippery floors.		
12.	Only loads within the rated capacity of the truck shall be handled.		
13.	Forks must be placed under the load as far as possible.		
14.	When you leave a lift truck unattended, you should fully lower the load engagements, neutralize the controls, shut off the power, and set the brakes.		
15.	A lift truck with a small hydraulic leak may be operated until the end of the shift.		
16.	If your lift truck does not have an ID plate, you should report it immediately.		
17.	A pre-start inspection must be done before every shift and documented.		
18.	Under ideal conditions, your following distance behind another lift truck should be at least 3 lift truck lengths.		
19.	If an untrained person wants to operate your lift truck, it is permissible as long as they follow the proper safety procedures.		
20.	When traveling with a load, the mast should be tilted back.		
21.	With a large load, you can lean outside the truck to get a better view.		
22.	You should use the horn to alert others at intersections, blind corners and other potentially dangerous areas.		
23.	Dock plates should be visually checked by the lift truck operator.		
24.	Use of the safety belt restraint system is required <u>only</u> when you are traveling with a load.		
25.	Giving someone a ride is O.K. as long as it is during working hours and you are careful.
