MAST (Montana Aligned Standards Test) tests will be given to all students in grades 3 rd through 8th this month. These statewide tests require 95\% participation-please make sure your child is in attendance that week. Why do we test you ask?

- -State and federal law requires schools to assess student learning every year.
- -End-of-year state summative assessments serve as an evaluation tool to track progress toward education goals based on grade and content standards.
- -Assessment data enables us to put students first and meet individual needs.
- -Assessments are a key indicator of whether state and federal monies for educational programs are being used effectively.

Happy Spring Clinton Families!
As we prepare for the 2024-2025 school year, with our KU5/Kindergarten Roundup, I'd like to remind you of vaccine requirements for school attendance. KU5 requirements are the same as Kindergarten. Please bring a copy of your child's immunization record to KU5/Kindergarten Roundup on April 25th.

DTaP or Tdap - 4 doses (one on or after 4th birthday)
MMR - 2 doses
Varicella (Var) - 2 doses

Also, students entering the 7th grade are required to have an updated Tdap vaccine, before the 20242025 school year begins. Please provide an updated immunization record as soon as possible.
