
Safe Passage is a program designed to steer children away from participating in troublesome behavior and possible gang affiliation. This is an outreach program for vulnerable youth from kindergarten through Sixth grade.

WHAT IS SAFE PASSAGE?

HOW IS THIS Accomplished?

Community policing asymmetrically provides the same basic needs the gangs have supplied. These needs include food, education, trust, safety and affirmation. Safe Passage centers are open six days a week, free of charge, to 100's of underserved K -6th youth who live within micro communities that have traditionally been targets for gang recruitment and violence.

OUR GOAL:


Make communities safe by eliminating gang-related crime by stopping gang recruitment and replenishment process among at-risk youth.

There has been a significant correlation between Safe Passage, reduced gang activity, and more willingness to call police for support.











COST PER INCIDENT BY A GANG MEMBER

SAFE PASSAGE IS PROMOTING LEARNING AT ALL LEVELS

Our first graduates of the Safe Passage program began college in 2020 with full scholarships (the first to graduate school in their families), and have become youth leaders for Safe Passage, guiding and supporting the younger members of the program (K-7th).



Volunteer educators work daily, outside, with the members of our youth community with special learning needs to ensure that they are not left behind during the adaptation to online learning.

SUMMER PROGRAMS

The summer of 2021, we will continue our summer programming which includes 10 weeks of outdoor STEAMO camp.
