

All Saints' Day - November 1: All Saints' Day is celebrated to honor all saints, known and unknown, now in heaven. It hogan to remember early martyrs and became a universal feasing



began to remember early martyrs and became a universal feast by the 9th century. This day reminds us we're part of a much larger family of faith, and that we, too, are called to be saints.

All Souls' Day – November 2: All Souls' Day began in the 10th century, when monks set aside a day to pray for the dead. We pray especially for those in purgatory, trusting that our prayers help them reach heaven. It's a day of mercy, hope, and love – connecting us with those we've lost.

Veterans Day – November 11: Veterans Day began in 1919 as "Armistice Day," marking the end of World War I. In 1954, it became a day to honor all U.S. veterans, living and deceased. As Knights, we thank them for their sacrifice and service, and we're called to support them with prayer, gratitude, and action.

St. Cecilia – November 22: St. Cecilia is the patron saint of musicians and singers. She reminds us that music is a powerful way to worship God and lift up the soul. As someone who sings in the praise band, I'm inspired by her example to use my voice in praise and service. On her feast day, let's thank God for the gift of music and those who lead us in worship.

Christ the King Sunday – November 24: Christ the King Sunday was started in 1925 by Pope Pius XI to remind us that true peace and power come from Christ, not from the world. It ends the Church year and points to Jesus as our leader and judge. As Knights, we're called to put Christ first and serve His kingdom.

Thanksgiving – November 27: Thanksgiving started with early settlers thanking God after a tough harvest. Today, it's a day to be grateful – not just for things, but for family, faith, and freedom. As Catholic men, we show thanks through prayer, hospitality, and generosity. May our gratitude inspire us to serve.

As we move through November, let's keep these days close to our hearts. By remembering saints, praying for the departed, honoring veterans, and giving thanks, we strengthen our faith and our brotherhood. Let's live these reflections in action with prayer, service, and gratitude.



Knights of Columbus Supreme Council Update

Pope Leo XIV received in private audience the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors on October 6 and commended the Order's charitable work, including "efforts to uphold the sanctity of human life in all of its stages." The audience took place in the Sala del Concistoro (Hall of the Consistory) of the Vatican Apostolic Palace during the board's pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee Year of Hope.

"Through a variety of initiatives undertaken by local councils," Pope Leo said, "you and your brother Knights also seek to bring the compassion and love of the Lord into your local communities, including through your efforts to uphold the sanctity of human li



through your efforts to uphold the sanctity of human life in all of its stages, to assist victims of war and natural disasters, and also to support priestly vocations."

The Holy Father expressed his gratitude to the Knights of Columbus for its role in restoring two 17th-century works by Baroque sculptor Gian Lorenzo Bernini in St. Peter's Basilica: the iconic baldacchino and the gilt bronze monument containing the Chair of St. Peter. The monthslong cleaning and preservation projects, underwritten by the Order, were undertaken by the Fabbrica di San Pietro in 2024 in anticipation of the Jubilee Year. "These masterpieces help all who look upon them to contemplate two of the principal tenets of our faith: the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and the pope as successor of Peter, who unites and guides the Church," Pope Leo said. "I would like to express profound gratitude to the Knights of Columbus for your generosity in making these projects possible. They are a visible sign of your continued devotion to the Vicar of Christ," he added, noting the millions of pilgrims who would see the restored masterpieces over the course of the Jubilee Year.

Pope Leo further noted, "Throughout its history, the Order has supported the charitable work of the Roman pontiff in a variety of ways," enabling him "to express solidarity with the poor and most vulnerable throughout the world."

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly and Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori met privately with Pope Leo XIV for the first time on July 4. During that meeting, they pledged the Order's loyalty to the new pontiff and provided an overview of the activities of the Knights of Columbus.

The Supreme Knight and Supreme Chaplain again met with Pope Leo shortly before the October 6 audience with the Board of Directors. In addition to discussing Knights of Columbus initiatives and sharing about their

recent visit to the Holy Land, Supreme Knight Kelly presented the Holy Father with a bound copy of personal petitions submitted during the Order's novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The novena, which was prayed for the intentions of the newly elected pontiff, began June 19, the anniversary of Pope Leo's ordination as a priest. The Supreme Knight also presented a calligraphed copy of a resolution in honor of the Holy Father, adopted by the delegates to the 143rd Supreme Convention in August.

"It was a wonderful meeting where we were able to express our thanks to him and what he means to us," said Supreme Knight Kelly following the Pope's audience with the Board. "We were honored that he expressed his gratitude to the Knights of Columbus and the works that we do to support the Church, to support the Vatican and to support human life."

U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Update

United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) will gather for the 2025 Fall Plenary Assembly on November 10 to 13.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) will gather for the 2025 Fall Plenary Assembly on November 10 to 13. Public sessions of the plenary on November 11 and 12 will be livestreamed. Throughout the meeting, the bishops will have opportunities to spend time in prayer and fraternal dialogue with one another.



The plenary will begin with Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, and president of the USCCB, delivering his final address to the bishops as USCCB president. He will complete his three-year term as Conference president at the conclusion of the plenary assembly. His address will be followed by Cardinal Christophe Pierre, the papal nuncio to the United States.

Among one of the first items of business for the bishops during the plenary will be a vote for the new president and vice president of the Conference. The terms for the new USCCB president and vice president will take effect at the conclusion of this year's plenary on November 13. The bishops will also elect chairmen of six USCCB committees. The bishops elected as committee chairmen typically serve for one year as chairman-elect before beginning a three-year term at the conclusion of the 2026 Fall Plenary Assembly.

The plenary agenda is not final and is therefore subject to change. Executive sessions are expected to include fraternal dialogues and informational sessions on a variety of topics. While these discussions are private, topics will include the ongoing implementation of the synod and fraternal dialogues (an opportunity for the bishops to freely and candidly discuss important matters in a synodal manner) around best practices to continue the instruction of *Laudato si'*, and the apostolate of the laity. The bishops will also receive updates on the Catholic University of America, and The Pontifical Mission Societies USA. Underscoring the importance that the U.S. bishops place on understanding artificial intelligence, the ethical implications of AI, its growing impact on society, and the opportunities and challenges it presents to the life of the Church, a presentation will be held in public session.

Pope, British King share historic prayer in Sistine Chapel

Celebrating improved Catholic-Anglican relations and a common commitment to Christian unity and to care for the environment.

Pope Leo XIV welcomed Britain's King Charles III and Queen Camilla to the Vatican for a unique visit combining ceremonial flourishes and a historic moment of prayer in the Sistine Chapel. According to Buckingham Palace, it was the first time since the Reformation in the early 16th century that the Pope and a British monarch prayed together at an ecumenical service at the Vatican. King Charles III serves as the "Supreme Governor," a position vested in the British monarch as the head of the Church of England.

From the moment the royal couple arrived October 23 in the San Damaso Courtyard of the Apostolic Palace, the high formality of the official visit was clear as a larger-than-usual contingent of Swiss Guards welcomed the king and queen, and the Vatican police band played the Vatican anthem and "God Save the King," which is the British national anthem. After a private meeting, Pope Leo and King Charles exchanged gifts: a mosaic of Christ for the king and an icon of St. Edward the Confessor for the Pope. They also gave each other framed, autographed photos of themselves. But the two also exchanged top honors. The King conferred on the Pope the "Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the Bath," which traditionally is given to heads of state, and the Pope conferred on the King the "Knight Grand Cross with Collar of the Vatican Order of Pope Pius IX." Pope Leo made Queen Camilla a dame of the same order.

Pope Leo and Anglican Archbishop Stephen Cottrell of York, the ranking prelate of the Church of England, then led midday prayer in the Sistine Chapel with a focus on "care for creation. "Pope Leo and Archbishop Cottrell sat in front of the altar under Michelangelo's Last Judgment during the prayer service, while the king and queen sat slightly to one side. Cantors from the Sistine Chapel choir were joined by adults from the choir of St. George's Chapel at Windsor Castle and children from the choir of the Chapel Royal of St. James' Palace in



London. Cardinal Vincent Nichols of Westminster, president of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, and Archbishop Leo Cushley of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, representing the Catholic bishops of Scotland, and the Rev. Rosie Frew, moderator of the Presbyterian Church of Scotland, joined the king and queen for the prayer service. Briefing reporters about the visit, Archbishop Flavio Pace, secretary of the Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity, said the moments of prayer and the exchange of honors were clear signs of the progress made in Catholic-Anglican relations since the 1960s.




Pope Leo and King Charles left the Sistine Chapel together and went into the adjoining Sala Regia to meet business leaders and activists committed to fighting climate change and promoting sustainability. After leaving the Vatican, King Charles and Queen Camilla went to Rome's Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls and walked through the Holy Door, prayed at the tomb of St. Paul and attended another prayer service.

As is customary, the Vatican press office provided no information about the Pope and King's private discussion. However, in a meeting with Cardinal Pietro Parolin, Vatican secretary of state, and Archbishop Paul R. Gallagher, foreign minister, the press office said, "matters of common interest were discussed, such as environmental protection and the fight against poverty." "Particular attention was given to the shared commitment to promoting peace and security in the face of global challenges," the statement said. And "recalling the history of the church in the United Kingdom, there was a shared reflection on the need to continue promoting ecumenical dialogue."




Cor Ministry of Prayer, Formation, and Fraternity




Recruit and Welcome New Knights



Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus Prayer and Consecration.

Prince of Peace Catholic Church and our Council hosted the Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus from September 30 through October 6. The Icon was placed in the Church Chapel


