

#### ADVENT WREATH -

Note that the wreath has four coloured bands: black, red, yellow, and white. The bands represent the Four Directions, as presented in First Nation's Medicine Wheels. Each tribe uniquely interprets the symbol within their culture. The colours added to the Advent wreath remind us that we gather on the traditional lands and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people. We are to strive for peace, hope, and wholeness; for there to be wholeness of land and peoples, reconciliation is an ongoing activity.

TABLE BLESSING for this season: Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest; let these gifts to us be blest. Deep within us come to dwell that we might all your goodness tell. Amen.
