The **THREE DAYS** - Here at Resurrection

Dying Well: Life through Death

– a sermon in three parts-

7pm - **Maundy Thurs. Service.** Sermon: *Thank you.*

A night full of rituals to hear and practice Jesus' commands to the disciples; anointing with oil, foot washing, the Last Supper, stripping of the altar.

5am-9am – **Good Friday** – the church is open for quiet prayer and reflection. Church service at 10am.

Sermon: *I'm Sorry.*

8pm – Holy Saturday, **Easter Vigil.** This service lights the paschal candle for the new year and through readings and hymns tells God's story of redemption through the ages. Those who attend are invited for wine and cheese at the parsonage afterward.

8 am – **Easter Sunday Sunrise service.**

8:45am Easter breakfast

10 am – **Easter Celebration.** Sermon: *I Love You.*

PREPARING IN CASE OF PANDEMIC

1. You are encouraged to gather phone numbers from people who sit around you in church. If you need to isolate yourself for any reason, or are unable to attend church, feel free to keep in touch with the community via the phone numbers you have.
2. Have a little olive oil (or other kitchen oil) on hand for anointing the sick.
 - a) Over the oil say: "This oil is fruit of the vine and a sign of forgiveness and healing."
 - b) Laying your hand on the sick, dip your thumb in oil and draw a cross on the forehead of the one who is sick. Then say: "Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, send your Holy Spirit upon your servant, *insert name*;; drive away all sickness of body and spirit; make whole that which is broken; deliver *her/him* from the power of evil; and preserve *her/him* in true faith, to share in the power of Christ's resurrection and to serve you with all the saints now and evermore. Amen. Pg 277 ELWB
 - c) Share Christ's peace with those present.
