This week and last week's bulletin inserts have been prepared using resources provided in *This Far By Faith*, an ELCA resource for African American Lutheran Congregations. It is published by Augsburg Fortress. Today's insert highlights the "Seven Principles." To learn more, you are encouraged to visit the *Black Cultural Centre for Nova Scotia*, in Cherry Brook, NS (near Cole Harbour). This facility is a museum and library resource centre that focuses on the history and culture of African Nova Scotians.

University College:

 Prepares and provides ongoing training to pastors and other leaders for ministry

- Trains students for careers in counselling where they strengthen the health and wellbeing of our neighbours in hospitals, longterm-are homes, hospices, and of people seeking help from counselling agencies and private psychotherapy practice.
- Operates the Delton Glebe Counselling Centre that provides affordable counselling service to students and those in the community and serves as a resource to pastors and congregations for mental health issues
- Provides youth with the opportunity to grow their faith as they pursue a university education through an undergraduate Christian Studies and Global Citizenship program
- Provides Lutheran experiment with new forms of worship in changing times (Thirdspace)
- Builds community and understanding across faiths and cultures – two examples: Kanata Centre for Worship and Global Song, and the Abrahamic Faiths Forum.

- Practices reconciliation with our First Nations neighbours and serves as a recourse for congregations that want to foster reconciliation.
- Demonstrates the fact that religion and people of faith- have a legitimate place in the public square through the Centre for Public ethics

# NGUZO SABA (THE SEVEN PRINCIPLES)

with related biblical passages

Umoja (unity)

To strive for and maintain unity in the family, community, nation, and race.

There is one body and one Spirit . . . one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father Ephesians 4:4-6; see also Acts 10:1-37 of all.

Kujichagulia (self-determination)

To define ourselves, name ourselves, create for ourselves, and speak for ourselves instead of being defined, named, created for, and spoken for by others.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people.

1 Peter 2:9; see also Numbers 13:31-14:9

Ujima (collective work and responsibility)

To build and maintain our community together and make our sisters' and brothers' problems our problems and to solve them together.

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.

Galatians 6:2; see also Nehemiah 3:1-31

Ujamaa (cooperative economics)

To build and maintain our own stores, shops, and other businesses and to profit from them together.

Whoever does not provide for relatives, and especially for family members, has denied the faith 1 Timothy 5:8; see also Acts 2:42-47 and is worse than an unbeliever.

Nia (purpose)

To make our collective vocation the building and developing of our community in order to restore our people to their traditional greatness.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses . . . let us run with perse-Hebrews 12:1; see also Esther 4:1-17 verance the race that is set before us.

Kuumba (creativity)

To do always as much as we can, in the way we can, in order to leave our community more beautiful and beneficial than we inherited it.

Whatever your hand finds to do, do with your might.

Ecclesiastes 9:10; see also 2 Kings 12:1-16

Imani (faith)

To believe with all our heart in our people, our parents, our teachers, and the righteousness and victory of our struggle.

This is the victory that conquers the world, our faith.

1 John 5:4; see also 2 Kings 16:8-17
