## Additional Budget request for marching band for 2017-18

To go toward summer 2018. This year cut 16% from school board budget so absorbed some. In order to grow (Mid States competitions), need more money. We placed 16<sup>th</sup> of 22 at MidStates, scored very high in music, but lower due to show design. Thinking ahead to new arranger – \$2,000 in board of ed budget for this – previous band director Canter used to pay 6,500 for it. Currently have a 367 shortfall for flow-throughs for kids who couldn't pay (some color guard, etc.). Proposal is to close December, see where we are at and revisit at January 2018 meeting. Probably will request another 1,000 to draw down from our balances/reserves.

**New pit equipment needed** – Ric will have a proposal for January regarding new trailer needed. Working with Fains on this.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

**Student trip** – MK shared alternatives to the cancelled Disney trip, that all kids can participate in at zero cost to them. Frontrunner ideas are: Orchestra and Choirs to see the King and I at the Aronoff and have pizza at Deweys. Band attend winterguard drumline and winds. Guard to guard event also. Would cost \$8,000 total but no cost to students. Dates for these are April 12, 13, 19. (Prom is April 21). We will discuss more formally at January meeting.
