This year's marching band season begins with the hiring of two fantastic educators for our instrumental music department at Finneytown, in **director Mr. Carl Phlipot** and assistant director **Mrs. Aimee Collins**. Mr. Phlipot and Mrs. Collins are accompanied **Mr. John Marque**, Director of Percussion for the past year in taking on another masterful, original composition by **Andrew Markworth**. Andrew is the front ensemble (pit) music composer for The Carolina Crown (2007-present) and Crossmen (2008, 2011-present) drum corps as well as Rhythm X Indoor Percussion Ensemble.

This year's show is entitled, **"Emotions Through Dreams."** Each movement of the show represents musically and visually, the concepts of "uncertainty, nightmare, love and triumph" respectively. The sophisticated work of the woodwinds, combined with the dark, powerful brass section, assimilate artfully with the colorful flag and weapon work of the color guard. This year's pit percussion and drumline are also working very hard to execute what is undoubtedly an ambitious and crucial voice in the show.

The past two weeks would not have been possible without the parent and school administrative support, as well as our wonderful pre camp and band camp staff:

Jodi Smith instructed flutes, Zack Stump worked with clarinets, Penny Sauer refined the saxes, Tom Frank was with our horns, low brass was handled by Shawn McGee and Adam Stokes, trumpets were with Brian Huhtala, pit percussion was Andrew Polter, drumline worked with Andrew Hartman, Mitchell Curry worked with new marchers, and our color guard worked with Kelly Wimmers and Christina McGuire.

Another season of hard work, critique and competition is ahead of us and we hope that you will join us for each competition and welcome in our wonderful directors to this warm and incomparable community that is Finneytown.

Beth Hofferber, Choral Teacher grades 7-12 Finneytown Secondary Campus

Beth Hofferber comes to Finneytown from Lakota West High School, where she was the assistant choral director and accompanist for the choirs. In addition, she also taught sophomore English and Advanced Composition for the Language Arts department. Mrs. Hofferber toured and performed with the Lakota West choirs in New York City and the Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey, as well as local concerts and OMEA competitions, CCM's "Feast of Carols" and a full performance of a major classical work each year. During her tenure at Lakota, she directed the pit orchestra for Lakota East's production of "Bye, Bye, Birdie" and served as rehearsal accompanist/vocal coach for Lakota West's musical productions.

Mrs. Hofferber has also taught music for five years at Winton Woods Middle School, one year at a middle school in Prior Lake, Minnesota, and as the vocal music director at North College Hill Jr./Sr. High School. She is a graduate of Miami University in Oxford, Ohio.





Aimee Collins, Assistant Band Director (part-time) Whitaker & Secondary Campus

Aimee Collins recently returned to Cincinnati from Tallahassee, Florida where she earned her Master of Music Education degree at Florida State University. While at FSU, she was the graduate assistant conductor for FSU Bands, including the Symphonic Band, the Concert Band, the Marching Chiefs, and the Seminole Sound Pep Band. Prior to moving to Florida, Mrs. Collins was a Band Director in Milford, working with students in grades six through twelve for three years. Her first teaching position was in Riverside, Ohio at the Mad River School District

teaching fifth and sixth grade band and orchestra.

Mrs. Collins is also a graduate of Miami University in Oxford, Ohio and was Drum Major of the Miami University Marching Band during her tenure there! Her primary instrument is saxophone.

Carl Phlipot, Band Director (full time) Whitaker & Secondary Campus

Carl Phlipot (rhymes with "hippo") brings a variety of experiences and enthusiasm to Finneytown Schools. He earned both his Bachelor's degree and his Master's degree at Bowling Green State University, where he participated in the Bowling Green Falcon Marching Band, the University Concert Band, and the BGSU Men's Chorus. His first teaching position was in Marion, Ohio as the assistant band director. From there he moved to Marion Local Schools in Maria stein, Ohio where he was the Director of Bands, grades 5-12 for three years and then on to Glen Este High/Middle School as Director of Bands, grades 6-12.

At Glen Este, the marching band made the top 10 at Mid-States Championships and the concert band went to State both years. Although he had a very successful program, his time at Glen Este ended after just two years due to budget cuts. Last year he was the Intermediate Director of Bands in Piqua, OH—but really wanted to be back in Cincinnati, so he jumped at the opportunity to work in Finneytown!
