
The new Orchestra Director is...

Band Camp 2014 - Lions Camp Crescendo

On July 20th, the Finneytown Marching Wildcats returned to Lions Camp Crescendo for the second year in a row, accompanied by music staff, clinicians, volunteer chaperones and enough snacks and supplies to keep 90 hungry teenagers well fed & cared for. Thank you to all the families who donated the items necessary for a successful camp week! I would also like to extend my most heart-felt gratitude to Chris Wolferst, Leslie Gamble, Tina Wuorinen, Sandy Blais, Angela Sena and Jenny Towner for joining me on this adventure!

For those not familiar, Camp Crescendo is located in Lebanon Junction, Kentucky - situated in quiet, rolling hills & offering picturesque views. Part of Camp Crescendo's mission involves supporting music education by providing grounds and facilities for marching bands to hold their summer camps, but band camps are a means to an end for the Lions organization; the heart & soul of Camp Crescendo is about providing enriching camp experiences to special-needs children in Kentucky, regardless of their ability to pay.

Each summer, four camps are offered free of charge to children with vision and hearing impairments, children infected or affected by HIV/AIDS, and for children in foster care. According to their website, in the summer of 2013, over 214 children were able to attend camp with no cost to those families.

Enamored with the scenery and humanitarian mission, Chris Wolferst & I sat down to talk with Billie Flannery, who with her husband, Ron, serves as camp administrator & a favorite grandmother figure for many of us. She may fuss at students like any grandmother would, but her passion for providing enriching experiences for disabled children is evident – and infectious!

That conversation sparked several ideas for how our students and community could pay it forward and contribute to this important mission in the future. A drive for camp related items such as pool toys, bathing suits and summer clothes could provide items needed by disabled campers; cleaning supplies and paper goods are always needed; and there are opportunities for older students to apply for camp counselor positions.

Certainly when there are difficult economic times, they affect everyone & we are not immune in our own community. Admittedly, as we struggle to secure our own funding and donation dollars, raising funds or collecting items for another organization may not be everyone's highest priority. But isn't

that what paying it forward is all about? And what a powerful lesson to teach our own children: no matter how challenging our own economic circumstances, every single person can still find something of value to give. That's what is at the heart of service – and that's among the things we do exceptionally well in Finneytown!

FMPA will once again sponsor its popular Savory Sweets Cookie Dough and **Popcorn** fall fundraiser. This is our 10th year with this company because of the quality of their products and the variety of flavors they offer that you can't find elsewhere. This is the BIG fundraiser of the year, generating approximately 50% of the income for FMPA's annual budget. If everyone does their part, the music teachers will be able to purchase the things needed to help students succeed in their pursuit of making the beautiful music that we all get to enjoy!
