RAISING PTSD AWARENESS THROUGH THE ANNUAL KAYAKATHON AND RESOURCE FAIR IN PORT JEFFERSON







On August 29th, 2025, I attended the vibrant resource fair at the Port Jefferson Village Center, which combined community spirit with raising PTSD awareness, particularly among veterans. The event featured food, beverages, and music, celebrating both community and cause.

One of the highlights of the day was the **22 PTSD Awareness Challenge**, an annual kayakathon from Bridgeport, CT, to Port Jefferson, NY, focusing on veteran mental health and raising funds for supportive nonprofits.

The Importance of the Kayakathon

The kayakathon symbolizes the journey veterans face with PTSD, raising funds and awareness for an issue affecting about 20% of veterans returning from combat. It fosters camaraderie and understanding, encouraging veterans to share their stories and find strength in community support.

At the fair, lively music and food aromas greeted attendees, alongside booths from nonprofits offering essential resources for veterans and families. Organizations provided information on mental health support, job training, and community integration, making the fair valuable for those seeking help.

The **22 PTSD Awareness Challenge** educates the public on PTSD's impact, including symptoms like anxiety and flashbacks. It encourages community engagement, helping reduce veteran suicide risk by **25%** through strong support networks.

The Role of Nonprofits


