★★ HISTORIAN ★ ★

This month we have an article from Bob Bittner pertaining to a Long Island Medal of Honor recipient. This man's sacrifice shows how blessed we are to be Americans. We have the freedom to enjoy this Christmas because of the sacrifices made by men and women like Army Spc. 4th Class Lang as depicted in the following:

AWARDED 1971. Army Spc. 4th Class George C. Lang was born on April 20, 1947, in Flushing, according to the Congressional Medal of Honor Society. Lang grew up in Hicksville and enlisted in the Army after graduating from Hicksville High School, according to a 2005 Newsday article. On Feb. 22, 1969, during the Vietnam War, while serving as a squad leader on an offensive mission to test the enemy's strength, Lang's squad found itself under intense fire from an enemy bunker complex, according to the society. Lang put himself in the line of fire while advancing on multiple emplacements from which enemy fire was coming, eventually destroying them with hand grenades and rifle fire. Lang then spotted a large cache of enemy ammunition, and attempted to maneuver his squad to it. However, they were fired upon by a third enemy bunker. Lang destroyed it with his last grenades. When he returned to the arms cache, the squad again came under heavy fire, this time by rocket and automatic weapons. Six squad members were killed or injured. Lang was hit and injured by a rocket, but continued directing his men until his evacuation was ordered, despite his protests. He was left paralyzed from the waist down as a result of being hit in the spine by shrapnel from the rocket, according to a 1993 Newsday article. Lang received the Medal of Honor in 1971 from President Richard Nixon, according to a 2005 Newsday article. Lang would spend the remainder of his life living in Seaford, where he became a celebrated Medal of Honor historian. Lang died from cancer on March 16, 2005. He was 57.



WELCOME TO THIS MONTH'S DR. CHAT: This months topic is Low back Pain! Almost all people will suffer from low pain at some point in there lives, however I'd like to focus on the issues that cause this affliction in senior citizens. There are many things that either cause or exacerbate Low Back Pain (LBP) at this point in our lives, the most common being Osteoarthritis which most of us have and can be the occasional LBP caused by activity and overexertion. This type is relatively easy to manage and tend to be self limiting and easily treatable. There are several things we can do to help prevent this type of LBP, such as:

- 1. Staying trim which is probably the most important, although as we all know the hardest.
- 2. Regular exercise and activity, this does not mean strenuous exercise rather regular daily activity such as a daily walk which you work up to say one mile per day. The distance is not important rather as much as the need to do regularly.
- 3. A simple back brace such as the ones you see Home Depot employees wearing which are inexpensive (\$20-\$30). These braces provide support but just as important remind you not to push your abilities to lift as you are aware that you are wearing one.

Symptom of LBP include pain in lower back and can include the Sac rap region. Occasionally if the sciatic nerve is inflamed you can experience pain that shoots down the leg and can be severe. There is usually restricted range of motion in the lower back usually bending over (flexion), occasionally there may be pain with bending back (extension). This usually indicates a more serious condition called Spinal Stenosis (arthritic narrowing of the spinal canal). Walking or any activity can exacerbate or worsen your Symptoms.

Treatment of minor LBP involves resting, avoid sitting for long periods, lay down several times daily, a moist heating pad, the back brace mentioned previously helps, Anti-inflammatory medicine such as Advil (Ibuprofen), Aspirin, and tylenol may be of benefit. Note: never take more than one anti-inflammatory medicine simultaneously as severe side effects can. If there is no improvement after several days of this see your physician for evaluation, treatment and possible referral for possible x-ray and orthopedic evaluation, Physical Therapy referral.


