It commemorates the adoption of the Flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The Flag of the United States of America consists of 13 equal horizontal stripes of red (top and bottom) alternating with white, with a blue rectangle in the canon bearing 50 small white, five-pointed stars arranged in nine offset horizontal rows of six stars (top and bottom) alternating with rows of five stars.

**June 6th, 1944:** More than 150,000 Allied troops land on the beaches of Normandy, France, as part of the largest seaborne invasion in history. Known as "D-Day," the name and date loom large in the memory of World War II—perhaps second only to December 7th, 1941.

**June 13, 1968,** a team of U.S. Army 5th Special Forces and South Vietnamese irregular troops were conducting a long-range reconnaissance patrol in North Vietnamese Army-held territory at an undisclosed location, most likely in Laos. Early in the mission, the patrol was surrounded by a battalion of North Vietnamese forces. After a brief but intense firefight, Specialist Fifth Class John J. Kedenburg, the leader of the team, provided covering fire from a rear-guard position as they broke out toward a clearing for emergency extraction. The clearing was small, so extraction had to be done from the air with slings. Amid withering fire, Kedenburg ensured everyone on his team got a sling. With no sling left for himself, however, he ordered the helicopters to leave. As he turned to again return fire, he was almost immediately overwhelmed and mortally wounded. John Kedenburg earned the Medal of Honor for his actions that day.

**June 14, 1775,** the Continental Congress voted to create the Continental Army as a united colonial response against the British enemy. This new Continental Army included 10 companies of riflemen.

**June 14th 1916** President Wilson issues a proclamation establishing June 14th as Flag Day. On August 3, 1949 National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress.

**Battleship New Jersey** No other U.S. battleship served in more military campaigns. Christened on the first anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, Dec. 7, 1942, it went on to earn 19 battle stars during 21 years of active service. Roughly 45,000 sailors and Marines served on its decks in World War II, the Korean and Vietnam Wars, the Lebanese Civil War and the Iran-Iraq Tanker War.

#### VA AIMS TO EMPHASIZE FREE BURIAL BENEFITS FOR VETERANS AT NATIONAL CEMETERIES

WASHINGTON — The Department of Veterans Affairs is nearing its goal to provide 95% of veterans with burial options at national and grant-funded veterans cemeteries within a two-hour drive of their homes. Yet less than a quarter of veterans and their families take advantage of the free burials, headstones and other services offered at the 158 national veterans cemeteries the VA operates, said Matthew Quinn, the VA's undersecretary for memorial affairs.

An informal survey by the National Cemetery Administration found that only a third of veterans were aware of the benefits. The National Cemetery Administration provides "perpetual care" at more than 5 million gravesites of military veterans. More than 135,000 veterans were laid to rest at national veterans cemeteries last year. Burial services are extended to eligible veterans, their spouses and qualifying dependents.


