VA PROPOSES DISABILITY RATING CHANGES https://www.ecfr.gov/current/title-38/chapter-I/part-4

The Department of Veterans Affairs is proposing changes to the VA Schedule for Rating Disabilities specifically pertaining to the respiratory, auditory and mental disorders body systems. The proposed updates to the rating schedule for these conditions will enable VA to incorporate modern medical data and terminology to provide Veterans with more accurate and consistent decisions. Veterans who currently receive compensation for a service-connected condition in these body systems will not have their disability rating impacted when the VA Schedule for Rating Disabilities is updated. Updating the rating schedule allows Veterans to receive decisions based on the most current medical knowledge relating to their condition. By incorporating modern medical data Veterans will receive evaluations which more accurately compensate them for their service-connected disabilities. Proposed updates include:

- Modernizing the evaluative rating criteria for sleep apnea, using developments in medical knowledge to evaluate it based on its responsiveness to treatment, bringing the rating criteria for sleep apnea more closely in line with the stated purpose of the rating schedule.
- Evaluating tinnitus (ringing in the ears) as a symptom of the underlying disease which causes it, rather than as a standalone disability.
- Evaluating mental health conditions based on a more robust and holistic approach that assesses how impactful the disability is to cognition, interpersonal relationships, task completion, life activities and self-care. Additionally, the proposed evaluation criteria include a 10% minimum evaluation for having one or more service-connected mental health conditions and will no longer require "total occupational and social impairment" to attain a 100% evaluation.

No change to a Veteran's current rating would occur due to these proposed changes. If the proposed changes are finalized, Veterans who currently receive compensation for a service-connected condition can apply for increased compensation, but no reductions shall be made unless an improvement in the Veteran's disability is shown to have occurred.

Why Can't We Just Get Along?

Last month we discussed freedom that we all enjoy as American citizens and even for those non-citizens living in America. Let's turn to the question of war. Why do wars exist? I would also say war exists because we are human. I laugh when I hear people argue, "If we could only get rid of religion then there would be no more war!" I think all of these easy solutions are diminished in a flash as soon as someone cuts in front of us while we are driving. Has that ever happened to you? Do you remember how fast you went from tranquility to anger? Can you imagine what it would be like if you had the power to exact punishment upon the driver while in the middle of your fueled anger and without any fear of consequences? I venture to guess that in the past you didn't express your anger in a violent manner because something restrained you. I'm confident you are aware that there are consequences to freely expressing your anger without restraint. Ok...you may have flashed them the singular symbol of sign language but it is unlikely you crashed your car into them. Do you know what that makes you? That makes you human. You have the capability to exert incredible destruction through anger and you have the potential to restrain that anger. Our Founding Fathers understood this about themselves and they understood this about others. They were also acutely aware of all the reoccurring wars throughout history and the pattern of abuse that existed by wars raged by monarchs and tyrants that possessed incredible freedom to exert their personal will upon others. I'm not proposing that race has not been a factor in American history nor hide the very hypocrisy that existed with those that formed a Republic based on liberty while restraining the liberty of so many people of color and native birth. I suggest that we in the 21st Century seize upon our successes and strive to diminish if not eradicate the very appeal to color as a measuring stick beyond its helpful use as a identifier like the color of our eyes. When we are able to acknowledge that all humans lean toward a propensity to abuse when unrestrained, then we will appreciate more the government that is designed to limit the power of license established by an abusive dictator or tyrant. Thank goodness we are not capable of being a dictator the moment we are cut off in traffic. How quickly we might find ourselves abusing our fellow traveler regardless of our skin color. I encourage everyone reading this to take the time and read the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States if you have not done so recently. These documents form the foundation of this Republic that we are all so blessed by. For the remainder of this year, we will embark on a journey to unravel how 13 Colonies united to form the United States and to shine light on just how radical it was for the times. It just might explain why so many Veterans are willing to go to war to protect this Country.
