COMMANDER'S NOTE:

If there is any time in the history of the United States that we citizens of these United States need to extend our gratitude for our Veterans, it is in the year 2020. I say this because the memory of all that our past Veterans have accomplished is under review and in my opinion attack. I'm especially thinking of the Veterans of the Revolutionary War and the Civil War. The fact that I have the freedom to express my thoughts on paper is a direct result of the sacrifices made by those serving to create and sustain this Union. Can you imagine what our Founding Fathers would say if they heard the things being said about them? I think they would be astonished by how quickly some today forget to view history in context. I think they would argue that they built an imperfect system of government but within its design was the flexibility and intent to address the evils of slavery as well as potential abuses of power by evil men. That is the entire point of the checks and balances built into the three branches of our government. It seems the loudest and most boisterous voices against the history of the United States are from the people with so little skin in the game and I'm not talking about race. It appears the people (of all races) that have not obtained something significant in their lives are so quick to decry the accomplishments of those who have. Those with little experience due to their youth often have many opinions but they don't realize because of their lack of maturity the profound sacrifices made by individuals in the past to sustain their freedoms. Those that have never deployed on behalf of their Nation and laid down or were willing to lay down their life for its perpetuation are also at times too quick to find the cracks in the foundation of the building they enjoy. Some may say that unless you are a person of color and have experienced the evils of racism then you have no voice. HISTORY.COM ARTICLE:

Veterans Day originated as "Armistice Day" on Nov. 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I. Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and Nov. 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938. Unlike Memorial Day, Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans—living or dead—but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

- Veterans Day occurs on November 11 every year in the United States in honor of the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month" of 1918 that signaled the end of World War I, known as Armistice Day.
- In 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower officially changed the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day.
- In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed by Congress, which moved the celebration of Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October. The law went into effect in 1971, but in 1975 President Gerald Ford returned Veterans Day to November 11, due to the important historical significance of the date.
- Veterans Day commemorates veterans of all wars.
- Great Britain, France, Australia and Canada also commemorate the veterans of World War I and World War II on or near November 11th: Canada has Remembrance Day, while Britain has Remembrance Sunday (the second Sunday of November).
- In Europe, Great Britain and the Commonwealth countries it is common to observe two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. every November 11.
- Every Veterans Day and Memorial Day, Arlington National Cemetery holds an annual memorial service. The cemetery is home to the graves of over 400,000 people, most of whom served in the military.

DR. CHAT

COMMANDER'S NOTE:

Dr. Chat is here for all of our members to send in articles of positive medical experiences they have or to give advice on what they did in a particular procedure. Dr. Chat came about after listening to the guys talk about their experiences at Bingo lunch. This is not intended to be professional medical advice but just the conveyance of your experiences that may help your fellow member. If you happen to be a medical professional then you can speak as Jose is in his article. Please enjoy Jose's article:

WELCOME TO DR. CHAT: This month I'd like to discuss Carpal Tunnel Syndrome, a common disorder of overuse that plagues many older people. Carpal Tunnel Syndrome is caused by compression of the median nerve on the palmer side of the wrist. The median nerve sits in a small groove or tunnel in this location. It is caused by repetitive flexion of the wrist and or repetitive lifting strenuous activity. It is seen in people with repetitive action such as typing, writing, hammering, etc.

It's important to note that this starts off mildly as tingling in the thumb, index and middle fingers which will progress to numbness this area sometimes it's also painful.it can be one wrist or both. These symptoms left untreated over time can become permanent. There are many treatment options available including bracing at night, activity modification, occasionally surgery is needed.

Consultation with an Orthopedic Surgeon should be sought as early intervention gives the best chance for resolution and prevention of permanent nerve damage. Remember early treatment will result in the best outcome.


