Patriot Day is a United States national observance that honors the memory of those who were killed in the September 11 attacks. It was first observed in 2002, after the proclamation by President George W. Bush. On September 11,

2001 al-Qaeda launched a series of coordinated terrorist attacks upon the United States, killing almost 3,000 people. In the immediate aftermath of the tragic events, President proclaimed September 14, 2001 a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance for the Victims of the Terrorist Attacks on September 11, 2001. A year later, September 11 was made a national day of mourning referred to as Patriot Day. This observance has been proclaimed annually since 2002.

The Southold Town Fire Chiefs Council sponsors a 9/11 memorial ceremony honoring the memory of those lost in the 9/11 attacks each year. It will take place September 11 at 6:00 PM at Jean Cochran Park on Peconic Lane in Peconic.

Last month, on Sunday August 25th we held our Annual Car Show. It was a huge success thanks to our Auxiliary Unit 803. Joan Cochran, Denise Schlachter, and Post member E.J. Flynn for their expertise and experience in planning and organizing this event. Furthermore, Thank You to all the volunteers that worked this event and came out to support the event.

The annual Walk 4 Valor will take place September 29th beginning at the Legion at 8:00 AM. The walk goes from the Legion to Orient Fire Dept and back again ending at the Southold Fire Dept. If you walk the entire distance, it is 22 miles. There are various segments of the walk if you want to participate but not walk the entire distance. You can refer to the Walk 4 Valor website for more detailed information. Walk 4 Valor will raise awareness and funding for measures to help reduce Veterans suicide and support the education of military families.

There is a new project currently being planned and organized by the Legion Post 803 and the Town of Southold to make available and install Veteran's Banners on poles throughout our community, similar to those you may have seen in the town of Riverhead. Denis Noncarrow, Rose Anasagasti and Marcia Kucera are presently in charge of research and development of this project. There will be more information available regarding this project in the near future.



#### ★★ HISTORIAN ★★

#### Lt. Michael Murphy Navy Seal. Born May 7, 1976, in Smithtown, NY.

Lt. Michael Murphy was a United States Navy Seal officer who was awarded the U.S. military highest decoration, the Medal of Honor, for his heroic actions during the War in Afghanistan.

In June of 2005, while conducting a reconnaissance mission scouting for the Taliban terrorist leader Ahmad Shah, deep behind enemy lines, his Seal team was compromised by a local farmer.

Outnumbered, cut off and pinned down by the enemy, Lt. Murphy gave up his cover and moved to an open clearing to get help for his wounded men, exposing himself to enemy fire to obtain a signal for his satellite phone to contact headquarters to relay the situation and request assistance.

#### Lt. Michael Murphy was killed in action on June 28, 2005.

On July 4th, American soldiers did a search rescue operation, and his remains were returned to the U.S. 9 days

later. He was buried with full military honors here on Long Island Calverton National Cemetery. (Wading River)

His parents Daniel & Maureen Murphy were presented with the Medal of Honor by President George W. Bush.

In my next newsletter I will give information regarding the Warship USS Michael Murphy (DDG 112) and his museum located in West Sayville.
