### 2018 FOUR PILLARS MURAL COMPETITION



I'm happy to report that I have received positive feedback from our local schools and MAJ Grigonis has stated that all three NJROTC programs will participate in this competition. What we need from members is their willingness to be on the Veteran selection committee to choose

the winning artist or group of artists. If you would like to be on the selection committee please give me a call at the Post. Here is a reminder of what the Four Pillars of the American Legion mural competition is about. We recently finished restoration of the Commander's Office with the help of the NJROTC, and there is a wall behind the Commander's desk that is boxed out forming what looks like a picture frame (7' 10" X 9' 4").

That is where the mural will be painted with interior latex paint. The goal is to have local students compete to win a \$500.00 scholarship in the form of a \$500.00 check directly to the student or team of students willing to participate in the project. Individual students or a team of students will submit their designs on canvas or drawing paper with a minimum size of 8.5X11 inches. Submissions are due to the Veteran selection committee by the 1st of June 2018.

The Veteran selection committee will review the submissions and choose the individual student winner or team winner. The winner or team winner will paint the mural (before end of 2018) at the hall with all supplies provided by the Legion to include lunch during work. The winner or team winner will also receive a \$500.00 scholarship check and will be our guest to be recognized at our installation of officer's dinner in June of 2019 (Parents included).

The timeframe for this project is the selection of the winner by the end of the school year and the completion of the mural before the end of 2018.



### **HISTORIAN**

April 30th 1975 marks the end of the Vietnam War but the sacrifices made by our service members lives on. This article ends with the following, "You have nothing to fear. Between Vietnamese there are no victors and no vanquished. Only the Americans have been beaten. If you are patriots, consider this a moment of joy. The war for our country is over." Regardless of what the North Vietnamese may say about the end of the Vietnam War we Americans must never forget the sacrifices our men and women made during that war. They had the courage to go to war and fight on behalf of America. The North Vietnamese words sting and are distasteful but I allow them only to highlight the greatest sacrifice those service members made to America. I can't imagine coming home from Afghanistan to Americans showing me disrespect because I wear the uniform. I want all the Vietnam War Veteran's to know that at Post 803 we remember and we honor you!

By dawn, communist forces move into Saigon, where they meet only sporadic resistance. The South Vietnamese forces had collapsed under the rapid advancement of the North Vietnamese. The most recent fighting had begun in December 1974, when the North Vietnamese had launched a major attack against the lightly defended province of Phuoc Long, located due north of Saigon along the Cambodian border, overrunning the provincial capital at Phuoc Binh on January 6, 1975. Despite previous presidential promises to provide aid in such a scenario, the United States did nothing. By this time, Nixon had resigned from office and his successor, Gerald Ford, was unable to convince a hostile Congress to make good on Nixon's earlier promises to rescue Saigon from communist takeover.

This situation emboldened the North Vietnamese, who launched a new campaign in March 1975. The South Vietnamese forces fell back in total disarray, and once again, the United States did nothing. The South Vietnamese abandoned Pleiku and Kontum in the Highlands with very little fighting. Then Quang Tri, Hue, and Da Nang fell to the communist onslaught. The North Vietnamese continued to attack south along the coast toward Saigon, defeating the South Vietnamese forces at each encounter.

The South Vietnamese 18th Division had fought a valiant battle at Xuan Loc, just to the east of Saigon, destroying three North Vietnamese divisions in the process. However, it proved to be the last battle in the defense of the Republic of South Vietnam. The South Vietnamese forces held out against the attackers until they ran out of tactical air support and weapons, finally abandoning Xuan Loc to the communists on April 21.

Having crushed the last major organized opposition before Saigon, the North Vietnamese got into position for the final assault. In Saigon, South Vietnamese President Nguyen Van Thieu resigned and transferred authority to Vice President Tran Van Huong before fleeing the city on April 25. By April 27, the North Vietnamese had completely encircled Saigon and began to maneuver for a complete takeover.

When they attacked at dawn on April 30, they met little resistance. North Vietnamese tanks crashed through the gates of the Presidential Palace and the war came to an end. North Vietnamese Col. Bui Tin accepted the surrender from Gen. Duong Van Minh, who had taken over after Tran Van Huong spent only one day in power. Tin explained to Minh, "You have nothing to fear. Between Vietnamese there are no victors and no vanquished. Only the Americans have been beaten. If you are patriots, consider this a moment of joy. The war for our country is over."
