Robert C. Mallgraf passed on December 11th at the age of 93. Robert was a true American hero. He served his country as a Sailor during WW II on the USS Franklin. The Franklin was attacked by Japanese bombers shortly before the end of the war, over 900 men were killed and the ship was nearly sunk. After the war he married Phyllis Baker and raised a beautiful family in Southold. He was a 65 year member of the Southold Fire Department. The Post Funeral detail responded to DeFrist-Grattan funeral home on December 13th. Special thanks to the members of our funeral detail.

Robert A. Villa passed on December 17th at his residence in Peconic Landing at the age of 88. Robert was an exceptional man whose entire life was dedicated to not just his family and friends but to his country and community. He was a 52 year member of the American Legion. A Legionnaire who was always there for us when we needed his help.

Harold A. Schwerdt passed on January 9th at the East End Hospice Kanas Center in Quogue at the age of 98. An American Legion Wake Service was conducted at the Coster- Heppner Funeral Home on January 13th. On January 14th at the conclusion of his Funeral Mass at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Mattituck the procession made a stop at our Post where the United States Air Force Honor Guard conducted a service which was followed by a repast at the Post. Harold was tail gunner on a B-17 that was shot down over Germany in 1943. He spent two years in a POW camp before he was liberated. He was the recipient of two Purple Hearts. A true American Hero. His faith in God and the love that he had for his family, friends and community was truly inspirational. Whenever Harold was around you knew that everything was going to be okay. His goodness will





President's Day

President's Day is the popular and commonly used name for the United States federal holiday officially called Washington's Birthday. It is celebrated annually on the third Monday of February.

President's Day honors and celebrates the life and achievements of George Washington, the first President of the United States (1789-1797) and 'The Father of his Country'. The day is, in practice, often used to honor and remember all past US presidents, and in particular Washington, Abraham Lincoln and Thomas Jefferson.



President's Day was created in 1879, first celebrated the following year. It was originally held on Washington's actual birthday (February 22). In 1971 this was changed to the third Monday of February. It was the first federal holiday to be created in honor of an American citizen.

President's Day is an occasion for community celebrations and parades. Many stores and businesses hold special sales. The Purple Heart military badge (which carries an image of Washington) for soldiers injured in the course of duty is awarded on President's Day

Purple Heart

The Purple Heart is frequently described as the military's oldest medal. Gen. George Washington created it in 1782 to recognize meritorious service -- basically bravery in combat -- but it soon fell into disuse. In 1932, to mark the bicentennial of Washington's birth, Gen. Douglas MacArthur spearheaded an effort to revive the medal. It was designed to commemorate bravery, but also recognized soldiers with wounds.



Later, during World War II, the medal was changed into a recognition of combat injuries and deaths. Over time, the military has further modified the award, adding different types of injuries and different types of combat. For instance, soldiers wounded in acts of terrorism now qualify for the Purple Heart, as do soldiers injured in friendly fire.

An individual soldier can apply for a Purple Heart, but more commonly, command superiors submit an awards package demonstrating that the soldier has met all criteria for the award. A superior officer can deny a Purple Heart, but such denials usually require review and then concurrence by a General-level officer. The process can differ by branch and by theater of operations.

Today, the military has awarded an estimated 1.7 million Purple Hearts to soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen. Unlike other military awards, the Purple Heart is an entitlement -- it does not depend upon the recommendation of a superior officer. Instead, the military gives it to those troops that meet basic criteria. In general, the wound must have occurred during hostilities and it must have required treatment that was documented by a medical officer.
