

I wanted to submit my speech for Memorial Day because I did not mention D-Day in the June Reporter and I think it is important to fight for one of our Legion Pillars that is under attack. That pillar is Americanism! Here is my take on D-Day and the greatness of America.

America is comprised of families and we all know that our families have saints and sinners, train wrecks and train conductors. How could we expect anything less of our country as a whole? We cannot expect our country or any country to have a perfect record. We individually and we collectively will have deeds that we wish never occurred. Media from all sides have failed to express this shared history.

Our family members are diverse as depicted in the alphabet soup analogy. There is no example of a group of Americans that know this best than those that have served in our armed services. Our armed services have evolved from a segregated entity into one of the most diverse organizations in America.

Our armed service members know more than any other organization in America just how costly our freedom of diversity is. How costly our Freedom in general is. Americans have the Freedom of Religion, Speech, and the opportunity to overcome poverty, prejudice, and to make a wonderful life for themselves and their families.

Today I proclaim to you that America has always been great because it is comprised of those willing to serve and even pay the ultimate sacrifice with their own lives for the freedoms we enjoy today.

America is Great and will continue to be so long as our citizens are willing to serve in our armed forces to protect these Freedoms.

Today, On Memorial Day we remember the fallen, we remember the maimed physically and mentally. We remember that we are free because of them.
