COMMANDER'S REPORT



Hello Fellow Legionnaires:

I'm happy to report that as I write this I'm enjoying a beautiful spring day. It is hard to believe given such a harsh winter. I'm also happy to say that our Auxiliary did a wonderful act in April. They presented a \$2,500 check to Vet Dog's an organization that

provides service dogs to Veterans in need. Pictures of the fundraiser follow this column. I'm so proud of what the Auxiliary does for our Veterans and the Post. Our Post has made wonderful progress. Our building projects are coming along and our membership is staying strong despite our sad losses. There is still so much to do and we can use your help to accomplish so much more. We need more ads for the Reporter as the cost of its production increases as our distribution increases. In the past we only mailed to our membership but now we reach a much broader audience. We went from sending out 226 Reporters to over 550 each month. That number is only going to grow as we reach out to our community and get more and more people involved. Recently we received a \$1,000 donation for the repair of our handicap ramp. We are now receiving bids on the job and it looks like it will cost us approximately \$4,000 to make the repairs but that \$1,000 donation will go a long way toward fulfilling one of our goals. On Monday the 30th Platinum electric will be going through the building making much needed upgrades and repairs to our electrical infrastructure. We will be updating our emergency lighting, creating a safer lighting situation in the basement and 2nd floor. Recently we met with the folks from ECOLAB and they will be updating our dishwasher cleaning system ensuring that every plate we clean is up to health department standards. Take a look at our 2018 goals and you will see more and more getting crossed off each month. The only way these goals get fulfilled is through volunteer efforts and fundraising. If you can volunteer then come on out and make a difference. It is also important that we pause this month during Memorial Day to honor those



MEMORIAL DAY HISTORY

Memorial Day, as Decoration Day gradually came to be known, originally honored only those lost while fighting in the Civil War. But during World War I the United States found itself embroiled in another major conflict, and the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars.

For decades, Memorial Day continued to be observed on May 30, the date Logan had selected for the first Decoration Day. But in 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees; the change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday. Memorial Day 2017 occurs on May 29; Memorial Day 2018 falls on May 28.

MEMORIAL DAY TRADITIONS

Cities and towns across the United States host Memorial Day parades each year, often incorporating military personnel and members of veterans' or-



ganizations. Some of the largest parades take place in Chicago, New York and Washington, D.C.

Americans also observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries and memorials. On a less somber note, many people take weekend trips or throw

parties and barbecues on the holiday, perhaps because it unofficially marks the beginning of summer.

COMMANDER'S NOTE

It is true that we take full advantage of this holiday for barbecues, parties, trips and there is nothing wrong with this. Those willing to serve in the armed forces are doing so in part because of the desire to ensure that Americans can enjoy their freedom. I know that most of my fellow brothers and sisters in the service will be enjoying a barbecue but they will also most likely toast those that have fallen and take a moment to remember. Here at Post 803 we will take the time to get up early in the morning and march in their honor. Please take the time to come out and march with us or show your support as a spectator.
