


SON'S OF THE LEGION

I would like to say thank you to the anonymous author of two letters signed, "A forgotten soldier." This author wrote me with some very useful information regarding the history of the Cold War. I would like you to know that if you're a member of Post 803 you are not a "Forgotten Soldier." We are proud that you served and we are proud you are a part of our family.

Let's now talk about the economic and military conditions facing Harry S. Truman in 1948. Truman was in the middle of his campaign for reelection when the Soviets decided to cut off Berlin. Truman was also faced with the responsibility to help guide America from a war fighting economy to a peaceful economy. Here is some interesting information pertaining to the demobilization of troops after the war. In May of 1945 there was 12.3 million serving in the military and 7.6 million were overseas. Shortly after the formal surrender of Japan on the 2nd of September1945 the American people put pressure on Congress to bring the Troops home. Alton Lee quotes Clare Boothe Luce the congresswoman from Connecticut as saying that every congressman was, "...under constant and terrific pressure from servicemen and their families." This pressure came in many forms but the tactics of the "Bring Back Daddy" clubs were quite clever. They sent letters with attached photos of their children and in one example they sent baby shoes with a note stating, "Please bring back my daddy." These tactics were not lost on Congress for example Senator Edwin C. Johnson sent the baby shoes he received to the war department with a note stating, "... be a good Santa Claus and release the fathers." Well, the pressure worked because the troop levels were dramatically reduced and by 1948 there were only about 1.5 million serving. Can you imagine the stress that must have put on the president and the country? How can you now employ all of those people? How can you transition the economy from producing war material to domestic items so quickly? More importantly how can you defend Berlin if war broke out and your troop levels are so low? Now we begin to answer why Truman chose not to use force. In my next column I will speak more specifically about the condition of the Armed Forces in 1948 while concentrating on our atomic capabilities.
