The parade started at 8 a.m. and ended at the Methodist church for a service and the reading of the Constitution. (Now the CAST building). It was followed by having a picnic and playing baseball and other outdoor activities. I asked our town Supervisor, Mr. Krupski, if that was a good idea and he responded that if we rang the bells at 4am, he would most likely be on the unemployment line the next day !

It has been 50 years since Israeli air and naval forces attacked the USS Liberty on 8 June 1967 during the Arab-Israeli Six-Day War. Thirty-four Americans were killed and 171 wounded, accounting for more than two-thirds of the crew.



Remembering the Men of the Liberty

- ★ Captain William L. McGonagle
- ★ Dr. Richard Kieffer, who treated the wounded for 21 hours despite severe injuries
- ★ Chief engineer George Golden
- ★ Radio operators who restored communications under fire
- ★ Sailors who drained boilers moments before they were hit
- ★ The 34 Americans who never came home

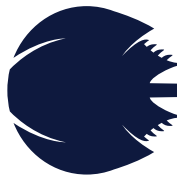

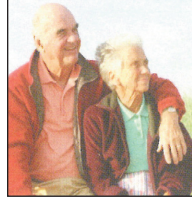
