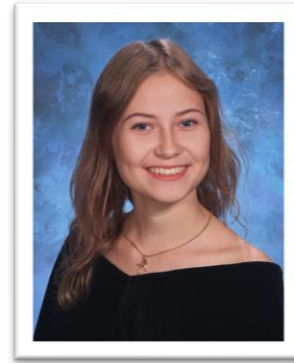

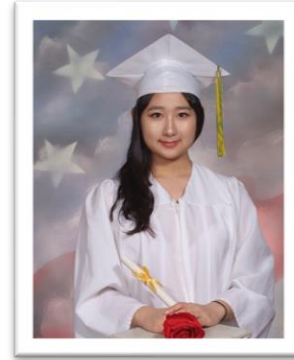
I will miss all my classmates and teachers in SGA. One of the toughest things I have learned is how to say goodbye.
