Dear Friends,

Webster's Dictionary defines fatigue as "weariness from bodily labor or mental exertion" and its causes "labor or toil." The dictionary goes on to say, "It is typically the result of working, mental stress, jet lag or active recreation, but also from boredom or disease, or simply lack of sleep. It may also have chemical causes — poisoning, mineral or vitamin deficiencies." Many languages have a word for fatigue. They include the meaning of anxious, stressed, and exhausted. It can apply



not just to the human condition, but also to the material world. Metal fatigues. Under unreasonable conditions bridges have been known to fail and collapse.

Our society is overwhelmed by fatigue, especially since the pandemic. Fatigue is caused not only by lots of hard work, but lots of hard play, as well as boredom from over-exposure to many activities. It's possible to become fatigued watching too much TV, yes — even too much football. Perhaps you have experienced "scandal fatigue" and "political fatigue" or "crisis fatigue". No doubt you can add to the list. and know personally what it means to be fatigued.

The concept of fatigue is even found in scripture. Sometimes Jesus withdrew from the world to refresh himself (*Luke 5:15-16* and *Matthew 14:22-23*). As an Episcopalian, you may be familiar with this quote from our Book of Common Prayer (Rite I, page 332) - "Come unto me, all ye that travail and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you." *Matthew 11:28.* Fatigue does not have to be a constant condition of life. There is hope. We can be refreshed and renewed.

Coming to church should not be a cause, but a cure for fatigue. Like Jesus, we can find rest from the stress and difficulties we face in prayer, resting in God's abiding love for each one of us, listening to His voice. God established the Sabbath at the beginning of the world to provide respite from the world's demands and clamoring. In the message of God's love, and in the living out of the message within the Body of Christ, the Church, a new and refreshed future awaits us. Seek and ye shall find.

As the summer months draw to a close, remember the fourth commandment to "keep holy the Sabbath day." Come, join fellow seekers, find refreshment, and perhaps less fatigue.

Notes from the Director of Music



Exciting Music Coming to Trinity

We have some wonderful events coming to Trinity. The next event in our concert series is the fantastic organist, Aaron Tan.

Concert organist Aaron Tan is a leading young artist in North America. In October 2021 he was awarded First Prize at the 2021 Canadian International Organ Competition as well as three additional awards for performances of specific works at the competition (the Sir Ernest MacMillan Award for Canadian competitors, the award for best performance of a work by Marcel Dupré, and best performance of a work by a Canadian composer). Originally from the Philippines and Canada, he is an organist and pianist who enjoys multi-faceted careers as a musician and a materials scientist. Aaron's concert is at Trinity, October 16 at 3:30 pm. There will be a gala reception following the concert.

Aaron has won numerous noteworthy contests and scholarships including First Prize at the American Guild of Organists 2018 National Young Artist Competition in Organ Performance, the Toronto RCCO Young Organists Competition, the Osborne Organ

Competition of the Summer Institute of Church Music (Ontario), the RCCO's National Organ Playing Competition, the Charlotte Hoyt Bagnall Scholarship for Church Musicians, the Lilian Forsyth Scholarship, the 2012 Poland International Piano Festival Competition, the West Chester University Organ Competition, the Arthur Poister Scholarship Competition, the Sursa American Organ Competition.

Having recently received both MM and MMA degrees in organ from Yale University, Aaron is currently pursuing doctoral studies at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester New York. Aaron also holds a Ph.D. in Materials Science and Engineering from the University of Michigan and worked there as a postdoctoral researcher in the University's Laboratory for Complex Materials and Thin Films Research, studying the dielectric and thermal properties of polymer thin films.

Linda has been on vacation, so I will start with Sandwich Board. August saw an explosion of new faces and increased need! Our August average number of nutritious lunches served topped 200 per week. I guess that inflation has truly hit our guests. Many new faces. Many gracious thank yous for the service we provide. We expect some drop off as the kids go back to school, but I expect that the norm will soon be over 200 lunches per week.

We polled our contributing churches to see if they can keep up with the increased demand and found out that the Sandwich Board is going to need to come up with an additional 90 lunches per month to supplement the ones donated. Gratefully, Episcopal Charities extended our grant from last year and gave us \$1,000 this year which will help meet our increased needs. We continue to distribute covid masks to anyone who needs them and just finished our second order of 10,000. When clothes of good repair are donated, we also distribute them. Children's clothes go fastest! As cold weather approaches we will also be seeking winter jackets and socks are always popular. Trinity prepares lunches six times per year.

Someone cut the receptacle off of our wonderful awning a week ago, for no reason! So we are going to have it hard wired in the weeks to come!

I also need to thank our dedicated volunteers and participating Churches. Without them this undertaking would be impossible! Please consider supporting this invaluable program!

Francis of Assisi Friar, 1226



Francis, the son of a prosperous merchant of Assisi, was born in 1182. His early youth was spent in harmless revelry and fruitless attempts to win military glory.

Various encounters with beggars and lepers pricked the young man's conscience, and he decided to embrace a life devoted to Lady Poverty. Despite his father's intense opposition, Francis totally renounced all material values, and devoted himself to serve the poor. In 1210 Pope Innocent the Third confirmed the simple Rule for the Order of Friars Minor, a name Francis chose to emphasize his desire to be numbered among the "least" of God's servants.

The order grew rapidly all over Europe. But by 1221 Francis had lost control of it, since his ideal of strict and absolute poverty, both for the individual friars and for the order as a

whole, was found to be too difficult to maintain. His last years were spent in much suffering of body and spirit, but his unconquerable joy never failed.

Not long before his death, during a retreat on Mount La Verna, Francis received, on September 14, Holy Cross Day, the marks of the Lord's wounds, the *stigmata*, in his own hands and feet and side. Pope Gregory the Ninth, a former patron of the Franciscans, canonized Francis in 1228, and began the erection of the great basilica in Assisi where Francis is buried.

Of all the saints, Francis is the most popular and admired, but probably the least imitated; few have attained to his total identification with the poverty and suffering of Christ. Francis left few writings; but, of these, his spirit of joyous faith comes through most truly in the "Canticle of the Sun," which he composed at Clare's convent of St. Damian's. The Hymnal version begins:

Most High, omnipotent, good Lord, To thee be ceaseless praise outpoured, And blessing without measure. Let creatures all give thanks to thee And serve in great humility.

Most high, omnipotent, good Lord, grant your people grace to renounce gladly the vanities of this world; that, following the way of blessed Francis, we may for love of you delight in your whole creation with perfectness of joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
