Membership in the Church

(A SUMMARY OF THE CANONS)

The National Canons address membership in the Church and the expectations the Church places on those members:

- 1. Members of the Church are those persons who have been baptized in the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit with water, and whose baptism has been duly recorded in this Church. Adult members are those persons sixteen years of age and older.
- 2. All adult members of the Church are expected to be confirmed in the Church, or if they have been confirmed in another Christian Church by a Bishop in Apostolic Succession, to have been received into this Church.
- 3. All members are considered to be communicants of this Church who have received Holy Communion at least three times during the previous year in this Church.
- 4. All persons in this Church are expected to celebrate and keep the Lord's Day and participate in the Church's public worship.

Communicants in good standing are those who have:

- A. Attended corporate worship on a regular basis in their Church unless they have been prevented from doing so for good cause;
- B. Have been faithful in the giving of their time, talents, and treasure for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

Rector's Report

Dear Friends,

I am in awe of what God is doing at Trinity. Perhaps many of you share in this feeling as you experience the unfolding of our worship, activities, and the changes in our facility. You will see as you read the parish reports that Trinity Church is vital and an incredible witness of God's Love.

Our parish family is greatly blessed in the servant leaders who serve on the Vestry and in our many ministries. Our leaders are prayerful, strategic, and committed. With such leadership, joined by dedicated parish participation, our ministries are in general thriving.

Average attendance at Sunday worship has increased to 49. The Choir and Greg do a great job enriching our worship. The Concert Series produced a number of incredible events. Those who made them possible, and the receptions that followed each, are a very dedicated group of individuals. We welcome the presence of children in the church. Before Easter 2020 it is my goal to have an acolyte training session, increasing the participation of youth serving at the altar.

During the summer, we inventoried our Godly Play materials and are in conversation with St. John the Evangelist, Lockport about exchanging them for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd materials. With these materials, we hope to put into place and staff a Church School program. Additionally, a friend of the parish has donated a large screen TV, that will allow for programs help us grow in our spiritual journey.

During 2019, Trinity has celebrated Memorials for a number of former members who had moved away, yet felt Trinity was their spiritual home. We also celebrated the life of and gave thanks for Peter Barber and who many remember for his parish involvement and overseer of the BBQs for many years, and as 2020 began, Ken Palmquist whose involvement guided Trinity in many areas. A number of new people have joined our parish family. I'm delighted to see the warmth and openness given to our new members and to our visitors. Letting people know that they are welcome and important is a real sign of our parish's spiritual health and maturity.

It has been exciting to see the facility changes and the effort put forth to make them possible. The list of accomplishments speaks to the maintenance and care of our treasured building and grounds. This year brought a new roof and the completion of our 2018 One to Grow On project of painting the church ceiling - walls too! Repairs continue to pop up on the heating pipes and some rather major electrical work resulted in rewiring the main nave lights. Some unexpected repairs to the parish hall stucco and the front fencing took place. 2019 was indeed a year filled with many facility improvements.

Our stewardship of the gifts God has given us It is obvious to any who walk through the doors of Trinity. We are a parish that cares; from our Prayer Request Book, our Prayer Shawl Ministry, and the hospitality expressed to those within our congregation, as well as to those in our surrounding community to the care given to maintaining the building.



Maria and Gary continue to make our grounds perfectly groomed and appealing.

We have almost finished digitalizing our Parish Records. Linda did the Weddings, Deaths, and Communion lists. I worked on the Baptisms and have received recent help from Judy Stefanick. Cathie typed in the narrative that accompanied them and Tom proofed them!

We also attended to little things. Improved lighting in the Parish Hall and Bathroom, new drawer pulls for the cabinet, the rock project, new Marquee and door signs that can be updated for the seasons of the year. New electric candles for the windows in the church, etc.

JUNIOR Warden Report - Ken Adam Reporting

It has been my pleasure serving as Junior Warden since John Heath retired. Since taking over this position in January 2019, we now have an active Building & Grounds Committee which meets once a month to review new projects and the progress of pending projects.

Projects completed in 2019 to present:

Replacing roof shingles and the painting of the ceiling and walls in the church have been completed.

2 flag poles installed with banner brackets.

Additional Solar Lighting is now in the parking lot giving us a much brighter parking lot.

Installed grip bars in restroom by kitchen.

Steam pipes have been taped and have been functioning without problems last 2 months.

The window in the Guild Room has been repaired.

The upstairs apartment and the basement have been cleaned up. All unnecessary items have been removed and taken away.

All electrical sockets and boxes have been checked and are in working order.

The 2 electrical boxes in the basement will be upgraded with more modern circuit breakers in near future The side door by the Organ has been replaced.

We have a new washer and dryer which are now installed and running.

Upcoming projects for 2020:

While we have accomplished a lot this past year, there are several projects which still need to be done in 2020. Here are just a few:

Reinstalling the shelf by the baptismal fountain in the back of the church.

Need a new downspout in the Chancel of church to avoid flooding. Flooding has caused the tiles to come up downstairs in the Chapel.

Work with our new neighbor, Michael Joy, on replacing all auto stops in parking lot.

I want again to thank everyone on the Vestry for the help they have given me this past year. I am especially grateful to Rob Borchert and Father Luckritz for their guidance and assistance.















Music Program Report

Annual reports are usually a "what have we done?" document. But, today, I am also thinking about "where are we going?" The Music Department is much different that when I arrived at Trinity. Then, I was mostly just the organist. There were people in the Choir Stalls, but they didn't sing an anthem. That changed very quickly. We first sang a setting of the Psalm. Later, we sang an anthem about every other week. There were three people. Over the years, we've seen the choir grow in numbers, and now we sing an anthem every Sunday, and at least twice a month we sing two. We have people who sing solos, duets and trios. People play instruments and we have special music all year long. This is a real choir program. And, I'm incredibly proud of the choir for their accomplishments. In 2019, we expanded the choir program into the Concert Series. In March, the Adult Choir and guests sang the Fauré Requiem. In November, a Festival Evensong, and in December, A Festival of Lessons and Carols, patterned after the model from Kings College in Cambridge, England. Festival holidays, such as Christmas and Easter continue to have special instrumental music. This past Christmas featured Steel Pan Drums with the Calypso Carol, oboe and alto duet with I Wander as I Wander, and Silent Night accompanied by harp. The whole service seemed to have a halo around it. Easter was a blaze of resurrection glory with Brass Quintet playing the Liturgy, hymns and special music.

The Trinity Ringers have become a regular part of our music program. They rang four times in the first season. This season, they are ringing monthly. Christmas Eve they learned a new technique using mallets to ring bells for the first time. Their reading skills and playing skills have improved by leaps and bounds, and I look forward to teaching them even more bell techniques. They are a hardworking, dedicated group of ten ringers.

October 2019 saw the beginning of our second season of Concerts at Trinity. The Salute to Broadway was a big hit with Paul Kraus singing so many big Broadway hits. I'll never forget him singing those love songs to two very special ladies in the audience. They smiled the rest of the evening!

Work continues on the organ. We had a major set of workdays to fix a number of silent notes and other problems with the organ. In many ways it was a reality check for me. Much of the organ's parts are from the original organ from 1922. With a good bit of coaxing, we were able to get most of them working again. Some are just old and need to be replaced. The problem is, they don't make 1922 parts anymore, and finding a used 1922 part is not good for longevity. Some things will have to be replaced. I am also reminded that the work done of the organ in the 1970's is now fifty years ago. For those of you who have had replacement surgeries, you know that of which I speak. The organ fund is alive and going. We'll keep working on the projects as funds become available.

One of my Church Music professors said to us, "Music IS outreach." So, I think that is part of where Trinity is headed. Revitalization of our facilities, increasing our sense of purpose, expanding our resources: these are all in our future as members of Trinity. As our numbers grow, the music program is reaching out to the community, bring people into our concerts, special services, and Sunday morning liturgies. Reaching out to people, touching hearts, showing God's love, painting pictures with sound. We do make a "joyful noise." And, a beautiful one, too.
