Dear Friends,

Recently, I've spent a great deal of time in quiet thought. With the constant reports of violence, war, and political absurdity, there is a lot to think about and absorb. Sadly, none of it is that new. Human history is full of examples. Many living in our world today have never known a time in their life without pain and suffering.

In my experience, when we are confronted with such darkness, there's an expectation that words of comfort, reassurance, and even wisdom will flow abundantly from the pulpit, filling the Church, filling God's people.

Sometimes, too many words get in the way. I have to admit that my brain has begun to shut off whenever I hear or read about the most recent acts of hatred. That is, until I'm alone, or the moment my head hits the pillow. Then I find myself swimming in it. Usually, as those of you who know me well can attest, I'm not at a loss for words. Writing sermons and newsletter articles normally isn't a chore. What is so different now? Why am I having such difficulty expressing myself?

I think perhaps the Spirit is trying to get me to listen. In the chaos of it all, I'm having trouble hearing . . . I'm busy digging in my head trying to find something, anything, to say. Nothing seems to be emerging, or is it? I find that one may discover answers if we allow ourselves to sit in silence, listening intently and patiently for the "still small voice" (I Kings 19:11-13) to instruct us.

In my quietness, something is happening. Perhaps the Spirit is finding room and God's creative presence is busy bringing healing and wholeness. As I look around and ponder the world I see, I find a tremendous amount to be thankful for today. These horrific events are being transformed. People are coming together, building community, bringing hope. It may not be perfect, but it is good. All the answers may not be there, but the potential for a new way of being is just over the horizon.

Hiding behind closed doors, the early Christians struggled to find a way forward, past the violence and fear. God's Spirit came to them. Jesus breathed it upon them, saying, "Peace be with you." (John 20:21-22). In those few words, their world was changed. As Christians, we too are called into that Peace. We too are invited to find healing and hope. And just as those disciples who went before us, we are commissioned to spread the Good News of God's Peace and Love in both word and, even more powerfully, in our actions.

The First Book of Common Prayer - 1549

The first Book of Common Prayer came into use on the Day of Pentecost, June 9, 1549, in the second year of the reign of King Edward the Sixth. From it have descended all subsequent editions and revisions of the Book in the Churches of the Anglican Communion.

Though prepared by a commission of learned bishops and priests, the format, substance, and style of the Prayer Book were primarily the work of Thomas Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury, 1533–1556. The principal sources employed in its compilation were the medieval Latin service books of the Use of Sarum (Salisbury), with enrichments from the Greek liturgies, certain ancient Gallican rites, the vernacular German forms prepared by Luther, and a revised Latin liturgy of the reforming Archbishop Hermann of Cologne. The Psalter and other biblical passages were drawn

from the English “Great Bible” authorized by King Henry the Eighth in 1539, and the Litany was taken from the English form issued as early as 1544.

The originality of the Prayer Book, apart from the felicitous translations and paraphrases of the old Latin forms, lay in its simplification of the complicated liturgical usages of the medieval Church, so that it was suitable for use by the laity as well as by the clergy. The Book thus became both a manual of common worship for Anglicans and a primary resource for their personal spirituality.

Almighty and everliving God, whose servant Thomas Cranmer, with others, restored the language of the people in the prayers of your Church: Make us always thankful for this heritage; and help us so to pray in the Spirit and with the understanding, that we may worthily magnify your holy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.



NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

CREDO, COMMITMENT, AND CALL

We say the Creed every Sunday. “I believe...” And what follows is a statement of faith. But, we say “I believe” many times in the week. A few nights ago I was watching a program where former basketball stars were predicting the outcome of an important game. Each said, “I believe that a certain team will win the game.” Another would counter with a different statement, but it still began, “I believe...”

The importance of this is the faith that is behind the statements. None of the former stars really knew who would win, but each of them “believed” with all their hearts that they were right. Listen to yourself this week and see how many times you say, “I believe.” Did you know you were making a statement of faith?

Most seminary students have to write a statement of faith before they are ordained. Many of them have to defend their beliefs. When we say, “I believe...” do we have the knowledge, sources, translations, etc. to defend our beliefs? When we open our minds and read scholarly articles we may find that our beliefs might need some updating.

Certainly, the Dead Sea Scrolls shed new light on many passages of scripture. Other documents have made us aware of words that have more than one meaning. In any case, remember that when you say, “I believe...” you are making a statement of faith.

As Christians we have a deep commitment to the teachings of Jesus Christ. The summary of the law puts it well:

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it; You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets. Matthew 22:37-40

We do our best to live lives that show God’s love to all people. But, sometimes we forget who our neighbor is. Or, maybe we don’t always want to know our neighbor. It’s always easier if we can get someone else to take care of our neighbor.

But, the call to be a disciple of Christ is to reach out to all those around us. It is a hard task, and an easy one too. Hard to start, easy once you’ve begun.

When was the last time you invited someone to a special event at the church? Or to join a group in the church, i.e., one of the choirs, a circle, or a committee? When we have visitors, we do such a good job of making them feel “at home” in our church. But, what about the “follow up?” I know there is a nice letter that goes out from the office. But that’s not exactly what I mean. What if they come back? What then? How do we bring new people into the fold of our Christian Community. When I came here, there were many things I was curious about. How did certain things get done. How did you know that everyone brought some special thing for a certain occasion. Let us all be aware of looking at the things we do through the eyes of visitors. They need a mentor to help them understand, and they need directions about how we do things.

The great hymnologist Erik Routley said, “Hymns are the take-home package of the Christian faith.” I think the hymn Jane Parker Huber wrote in 1981 sums it up well:

*Called as partners in Christ’s service,
Called to ministries of grace,
We respond with deep commitment
Fresh new lines of faith to trace.
May we learn the art of sharing
Side by side and friend with friend,
Equal partners in our caring
To fulfill God’s chosen end.*

*Christ’s example, Christ’s inspiring,
Christ’s clear call to work and worth,
Let us follow, never faltering,
Reconciling folk on earth.
Men and women, richer, poorer,
All God’s people, young and old,
Blending human skills together
Gracious gifts from God unfold.*

Finally, some movement on finishing the updates to the Chancel. Michael Miller, the woodworker that we had hired to complete the project has been dismissed by the Vestry. Another skilled woodworker is currently developing bids to not only complete the Chancel work but also to upgrade the Chapel. The Chapel renovation will include; 1) the rebuilding of the Chapel exterior door with a waterproof sill to prevent flooding; w2) Installing a new water resistant stone floor; 3) Removal of the carpeting and riser around the Altar and upgrading of the floor; 4) Upgrading the lighting. Hopefully this will all be accomplished before the end of the summer.

The kitchen cabinets have all been repainted and we are awaiting the painting of the ceiling and walls in a light tan to go with the brown and tan backsplash. These improvements, coupled with the new stainless-steel countertop will make the kitchen shine!

Exterior painting continues as we find peeling paint to be an ongoing problem.

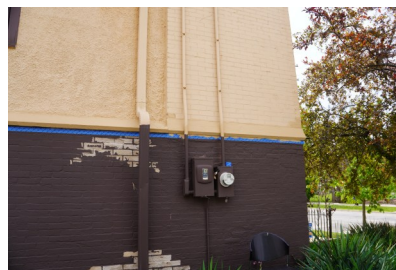
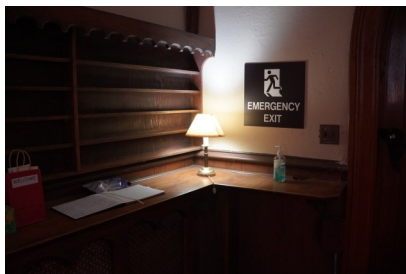
Earlier this year Michels Plumbing corrected a long-standing problem with the pipes under the Guild Room. I remember Father Burden holding up a rusted-out pipe from there and involving the hillbilly prayer that the pipes would last another year, 1996! The pipes were flat and the steam would pool in the pipes and rust them through. As of last count we had replaced the pipes twice and the current pipes had 4 patches on them. It sounds like an easy fix but took a week and was pricey. I have worked with a number of plumbers through the years and Michels is by far the best. A side benefit of the work was the basement pretty much got cleaned up and out!

When we had the roof replaced last year, they installed new downspouts. Recently one of those fell down. Maria saved all the parts and the downspout was re-installed correctly!

Cathie Patterson is currently soliciting bids to correct the erosion problem we have at the Benton entry to the parking lot. We repave the entry every few years and the water washes the pavement away.

In a program related development. It looks like we have received sufficient donations to purchase a set of Bells and related equipment to rekindle our Bell Choir. Morer news to come.

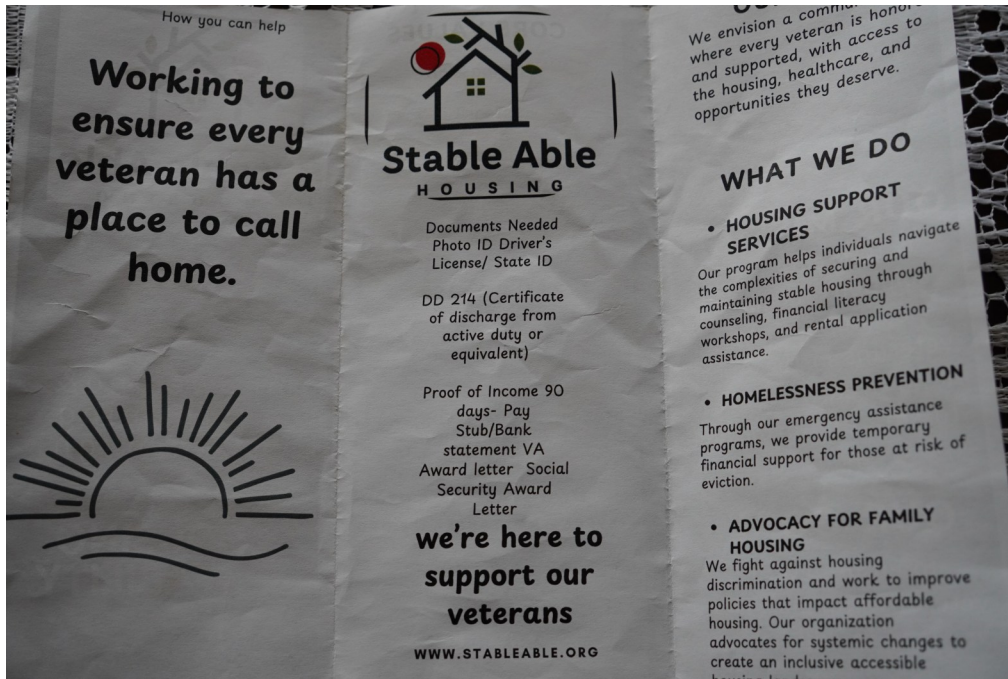
