

## OUR HOPE AND GOD'S PROMISE

The Church uses these waning November days and darker skies as the season to remind us of the last things. Today's feast, the Solemnity of All Saints, is the centerpiece of three days that point to doctrines we proclaim each time we say the Apostles' Creed: "We believe in the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting." And while the days and our hearts may be dark, the readings today are bright with the light of faith. John's vision in the book of Revelation reveals dazzling angels and white-robed saints gathered in triumph around the throne of God. In the responsorial psalm we sing our longing to see God's face, and in the second reading John writes that we are God's children and will, in fact, see God "as he is" (1 John 3:2). This is our hope. This is God's promise. Today we celebrate the triumph of those who already gaze on the face of God. Tomorrow we cry out for mercy with those in purgatory, who, like us on earth, still long to see God's face.

**First Reading** — John's vision of a vast throng from every nation and people, whose robes had been made white in the blood of the Lamb (Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14).


**Psalm** — Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face (Psalm 24).

## *Solemnity of All Saints*

Today we celebrate a glorious family reunion, the solemn feast that gives us a glimpse of all our brothers and sisters in Christ who have gone home to God before us. When we quiet ourselves to hear the Word of God today, we recall the mystery of our salvation. We praise the Lord who saves our loved ones who have died and who promises to have mercy on us as well. The reading from Revelation amazes us with its sweeping images of countless souls basking in God's glory. The Responsorial Psalm echoes our own longing to join those saints and look on the face of God. Saint John's letter affirms our deep desire to be with God, providing robust advice about how we may realize our hope: by living purely. The familiar words of Matthew's Beatitudes show the way to purity—and to genuine happiness, now and forever.

## **WHO WANTS TO BE A SAINT?**

This question can be understood in two very different ways. One the one hand it asks: Who might step forward to accomplish this feat? On the other hand, it wonders: Who wants to bother putting forth the effort? Perhaps we have read too many of the wrong "lives of the saints" to want to be one of them. So often those stories describe extraordinary feats of physical punishment. Anyone who thinks that such abuse is what makes a saint should listen to St Ireneaus of Lyons. He insists, "The glory of God is man (Christ) fully alive." Sainthood is allowing the sanctifying grace of God to dwell habitually in us and make us like he who is fully alive-Jesus Christ. However, what does "fully alive" really mean?

To be fully alive means to be people of faith; to have deep principles and to live by them, regardless of the cost. It means to realize that we are part of the wondrous creation of nature, and we must respect our place in it and our responsibilities for it. It means to care for others as well as for ourselves. All of this is grounded in faith in God, who loves us enough to make us and who made us fully alive. However, it is not always easy to live this out. Here is where the struggle comes in. We don't have to create struggle; life will do that for us. Still, to be fully alive is well worth the price we might be asked to pay. Isn't it?

## *Dear St. John's Family,*

I have excellent news to share with you. We are on our second phase for our woods project. I talked to Mr. Rey, our contractor for the project; he is in the process of eliminating dead and unwanted trees. As soon as he is done with the clearing, he will advise us on the best step to take to make our wooded area indeed beautiful. After that, we will start planning for the construction of Stations of the Cross and Rosary Garden.

We are almost done with paying our Bishop's Annual Stewardship Appeal Pledge. For 2020 we contributed \$82,743.00. We answered the Bishop's challenge on raising our participation percentage from 35.70% in 2019 we raised it to 47.94% this year. The average parish participation in the Diocese is 22.16%. Out of 534 registered family members, 256 participated. This year's result is a testament to your generosity and unwavering support to our Bishop and the many works that the appeal funds, e.g., Vocation, Catholic Charities, etc.





### THE MISSION



### THE REWARD
