Things to consider for choosing a location:

- Distance / Travel options
 - O Distance is somewhat limited for 2-night weekends, but we have gone over 200 miles for special cause Guadalupe River, Texas State Railroad.
 - o Three-day weekends allow for more distance by leaving early Sat and returning on Monday.
 - We usually avoid 1-night weekends because it can feel like all that you do is drive, set up, and take down. This works OK for 100% backpacking.
- Activities some have better trails, water activities, etc.
- Cost Scout camps are usually free. State parks can be expensive.
- Reservations some allow it, but others are 1st come, 1st served can be chancy on a Friday night!
- State parks usually have great facilities, but campsite quality is unpredictable and they do not guarantee adjacent campsites!
- Personal references are very helpful, if we don't already know the campground.

Summer Camp Options

Things to consider for choosing a location:

- Distance / Travel options
 - Time limit is 10 hours/day of driving time, except in a bus, so basically about 600 miles/day in cars or vans.
 - o 800-900 miles is achievable in cars or vans leaving early Sat AM, but requires spending a night intransit. More distance would probably require 2 nights in route.
 - A charter bus extends the range and reduces the time, but at greater cost. Need 50-52 people to fill the bus, so early commitments are needed!
- Program offering—high adventure options?
- Camp cost (most camps are reasonably similar)
- Climate (Sleeping in a hot, humid tent is tough. Colorado can be pleasantly cold at night!)
- Campsite limits (Some camps are strict on # of people. Some others are not.)
- Personal references are very helpful, if we don't already know the camp.
- Timing Considerations: Most Camps have training during the first week of June + 4-8 weeks of camp. .
