Primary Deadlines:

- Last day to register to vote online → Apr 27, 2026
- Last day to register in-person at Election Office → May 1, 2026 6:00 PM
- Last day to request early ballots → May 1, 2026 6:00 PM
- Last day to return mail-in ballots through postal services → May 5, 2026
- Last day to vote early at Election Office → May 11, 2026
- **PRIMARY ELECTION DAY** → **May 12, 2026**

Tips for Voters:

- Make sure to take your ID with you to vote in-person. Nebraska now requires all voters to show some form of identification at your select polling place
- If you are registered as NONPARTISAN make sure to ask for a partisan ballot to be able to vote for those federal and state races!
- You CAN leave a section blank on your ballot
 - For instance, lets say the candidates running for NE Legislature aren't speaking to you, you can choose to leave that section blank
- You CAN use your phone while voting in person! If you need to look something up, definitely do that!
- If you mess up, you can ask for a new ballot
- If you have any accessibility needs make sure to ask a poll worker or report them directly to the Election Office!
- If you go to vote at your polling place and they can't find your info, first make sure that you registered to vote, second, make sure that you are at the right polling place, and third if you know that you are in the right place, you can ask for a provisional ballot. You will then be asked to verify your info in order for your ballot to be counted.

U.S. SENATE:

The duties of the [U.S. Senators](#) include representing the state's interests in Washington, D.C., which involves voting on federal legislation and treaties, overseeing national policy, and working on committees related to issues like agriculture, foreign relations, and spending. Serve 6-year terms. Salary = \$174K

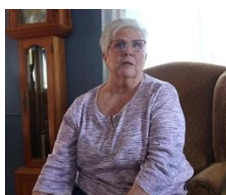
2. Todd Knobel

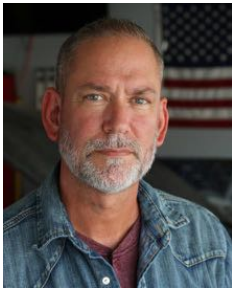

Referred to usually as [Congress](#) - has the exclusive power to introduce all bills for raising revenue, initiate impeachment proceedings against federal officials, and elect the president if no candidate receives a majority of electoral votes. As part of the legislative branch, it also conducts investigations and oversees government operations. Serve 2-year terms. Salary = \$174K

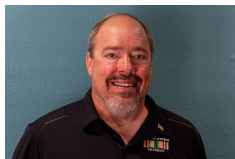
1. Jim Pillen

The [Nebraska State Treasurer's](#) duties include managing state funds by receiving, disbursing, and investing them, maintaining accurate financial records, and reporting on the state's financial condition to the Legislature. The office is also responsible for administering unclaimed property, child support payments, and serving on several state boards. 4 year term. Salary = \$85K

They handle both civil and criminal cases, defend the state from lawsuits, and oversee various specialized bureaus like Consumer Protection, Civil Litigation, and a Criminal Bureau. 4 year term. Salary = \$95K

The office investigates waste, fraud, and mismanagement, sets uniform accounting standards for county officers, and reviews audits for local governments. 4 year term. Salary = \$85K

NEBRASKA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

The Nebraska Public Service Commission is composed of five elected Commissioners serving six-year terms. The [Nebraska Public Service Commission \(PSC\)](#) is a constitutionally created, independent regulatory body that oversees telecommunications, natural gas utilities, major oil pipelines, railroad safety, intrastate motor carriers, and grain warehouses. It regulates rates, ensures service quality, and enforces safety standards for these industries while handling consumer complaints. 6 year term Salary = \$75K

NEBRASKA STATE LEGISLATURE

The [Nebraska state legislature](#) is the state's lawmaking body, responsible for creating laws, setting the state budget through appropriations, and overseeing the executive branch. 4 years (limited to 2 consecutive terms) Salary = \$12K

*OMAHA ONLY >>> (the race is nonpartisan but we know that's just not the case so they are left highlighted)

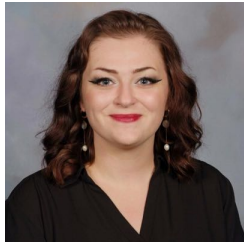

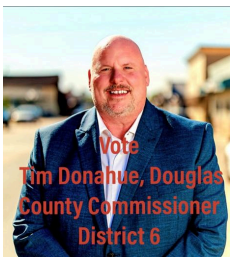

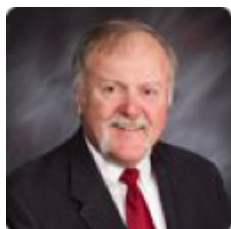
