


COUNCIL NEWS

As we embrace another month of blessing and challenges, we are pleased to share with you what is happening at LSSA.

We are busy preparing for the annual Thanksgiving Blessing and asking that you let this be a reminder of the strength and solidarity that binds us as a community. The Lutheran faith has always emphasized the profound gratitude we owe to God, not only for the gift of salvation through Christ but for the daily provisions and blessings that sustain our lives. It's also a time to remember our neighbors.

We ask that you help bring Thanksgiving to our community by donating green beans, corn, turkey stuffing and gravy mixes to reach our goal of serving 1400 food boxes. Distribution will be on Monday, November 20th at Central Lutheran Church from 2pm to 7pm. The format will remain the same as in the last few years when our guests will remain in their vehicles and drive by in the parking lot to pick up their turkeys and fixings. We plan to build the boxes of dry goods on Saturday, November 18th, from 10am to 12noon and again from 1pm to 3pm. If you wish to volunteer, please call the office. If you sign up for distribution on Monday, please dress warmly as all work will be outside.

The number of visitors to the food pantry is still increasing and the alarming trend that concerns us is the number of households who are visiting for the first time. Clients are feeling the effects of delay with their SNAP benefits. Anything you can do to help us stock our shelves is greatly appreciated. Items like canned meats (especially tuna), soups, mini ravioli, peanut butter and jelly, canned fruits (especially peaches), cereals, oatmeal or hamburger helpers are in high demand.

We are also looking for volunteers to help pre-bag food for the Mobile Food Pantry. This is an indoor opportunity for the winter months at the Food Bank of Alaska every Tuesday from 1:30pm to 3:00pm. If you can help, please call Lauren at the LSSA office.

May God's boundless grace continue to illuminate your path, and may the spirit of Thanksgiving fill your hearts, homes, and congregations. In this season and always, may you find countless reasons to give thanks.
