The numbers of new clients visiting the Food Pantry has continued throughout August. Anything you can do to help us stock our shelves is greatly appreciated. Items like canned meats (especially tuna), soups, mini ravioli, peanut butter and jelly, canned fruits (especially peaches), cereals, oatmeal or hamburger helpers are in high demand. Also, if you have plentiful harvest from your gardens that you would like to share, please drop it off at the Food Pantry.

Thank you to everyone who donated funds, school supplies, or volunteered your time at this year's HUGSS (Help Us Give School Supplies). This was the first year that we distributed in person after a 3-year Covid model of delivering the supplies directly to the schools. We are still tallying the registration forms, but it looks like we served 2,261 students from the Anchorage School District.

The Harvest of Hope Auction is scheduled for Friday, September 15, 2023, at the Sheraton Anchorage. Tickets can be purchased on-line on the website listed above and clicking the Seeds of Hope Auction tab to RSVP. We will need some volunteers on the day of the auction to help move auction items from our office to the hotel and then help with set-up or at the event itself. Please call the office to let us know if you can help.

Plans are under way for Thanksgiving Blessing that will take place on Monday, November 20th at Central Lutheran Church. The format will remain the same as last few years where our guests will remain in their vehicles and drive by in the parking lot to pick up their turkeys and fixings. We again will be asking congregations to help collect cans of corn, green beans, and boxes of stuffing. We plan to build the boxes of dry goods on Saturday, November 18th and add the cooler items on Monday as we distribute. We will also be sending you a link in November to sign up to volunteer.
