Lisa Falisconi's Presentation notes

- In November
 - RTN held a UDL session with Pam Tupy from Novak Education (Universal Design for Learning)

 TEVA regional and internal (WQSB) committees have been collaborating – to expand the process to include more students in their transition to life after school – regional (CISSSO/CISSSAT) interventions and collaboration to continue – more information is forthcoming!

December

- o Retirement of one of our consultants new FT consultant has joined the team
- January
 - RTN session coming: "Shifting the Balance" bringing the Science of Reading into classrooms
 - CEBM (Centre of Excellence for Behaviour) "Beyond Behaviours" and working with administrators on supportive interventions in schools
 - K registration process is coming soon transitions to kindergarten will begin as well as information session for early admission derogations
 - Department and school teams will start process for 25-26 planning and transitions to secondary

 offered in the future. Although it was added that the data was not tracked the
 same so it cannot be done now.
- The circumstances around incidents in the Anti-bullying/Anti-violence report are not shared.
