PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

When I was twenty-two, a college friend and I decided that we would spend the summer traveling around Europe. Another friend took us to New York where we

booked a round-trip ticket on Icelandic Airlines. They were still using turboprop planes in those days. We traveled via car, train, and thumb from Italy to Sweden and everywhere else in between. When we hitchhiked, we always tried to be neat neatly dressed and on our bags we each displayed an American Flag. The American flag means something.

The first flags, known as the Stars and Stripes, went through twenty-seven versions before the official one was adopted on June 14, 1777. It symbolized unity and identity. The flags were created as an item of military equipment to identify United States ships and forts. During the War of 1812 the British ships were fighting the Americans in Baltimore Harbor. In the morning after the battle Francis Scott Key looked up to Fort McHenry and saw the tattered American flag still flying. In 1814 he wrote a poem that later became the words of our National Anthem.

The popularity of the American flag exploded in 1861 after Fort Sumter was bombarded at the beginning of the Civil War. The battered flag that survived the bombardment was taken down and went with the evacuated American troops. After the war it was brought back and raised again at the fort. Each fighting unit had their own individual flag, but it was the American Flag of the Northern armies that united the troops.

The Stars and Stripes represent freedom. This month we celebrate two hundred and fifty years of freedom. No other country can say that. In celebrating this nation's birthday, we also must remember that freedom is not free. It must be maintained and even fought for. After years of history that have passed, we are still here. The freedom we have in this country has given us so much. We are grateful to those

Advance planning cannot prevent severe weather, but it can reduce confusion, lower anxiety and help families make safer choices when conditions change.

WSPD SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE ENDS JULY 31ST

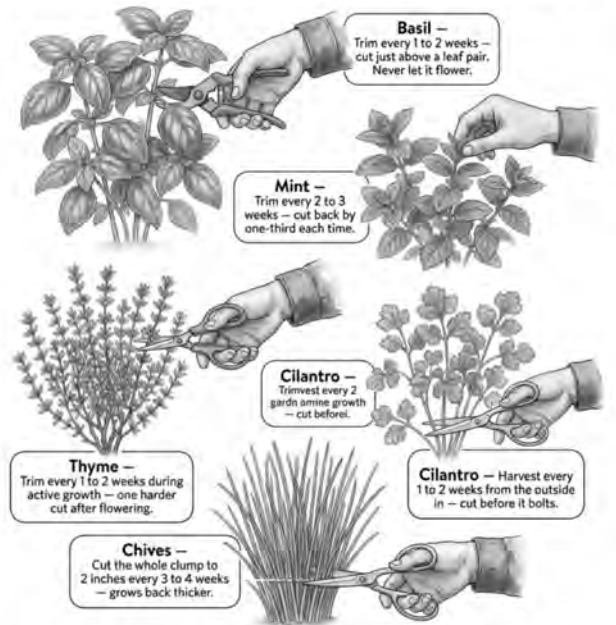


The Winter Springs Police Department is conducting a school supply drive to support students of all ages in our community.

They are accepting donations of new and unopened school supplies including notebooks, pencils and other essential items. **Plain backpacks are especially needed and are our highest priority this year.**

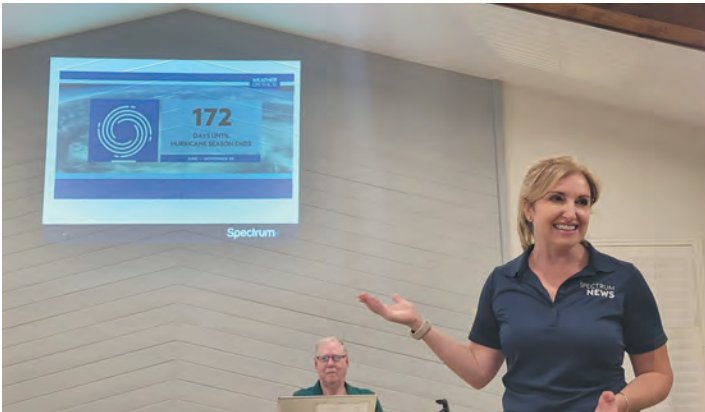
All contributions will directly benefit local students preparing for the upcoming school year. Donations may be dropped off at City Hall or the Police station located at 300 North Moss Road.

TUSCAWILLA'S OWN MAUREEN McCANN SHARES HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS ADVICE



Tusawilla residents gathered on June 11 for an informative and timely presentation on preparing for the 2026 hurricane season, led by Spectrum News 13 meteorologist Maureen McCann.

While many Central Floridians recognize Maureen from her weather reports on Spectrum News 13, those attending the presentation were also reminded that she is one of our own. Maureen is a Tusawilla resident who lives in the community with her husband, Bryan, and their family. Her presentation offered neighbors the special opportunity to hear directly from a trusted weather professional who understands both the challenges of forecasting Florida's weather and the concerns of the community she calls home.

During the program, Maureen emphasized the importance of planning ahead, staying informed and making preparations before a storm threatens Central Florida. Her message encouraged residents to be "prepared, not scared," reminding everyone that thoughtful preparation can reduce confusion and help families make safer decisions when severe weather approaches.



Maureen brings extensive knowledge and experience to this important topic. She earned her bachelor's degree in meteorology from Cornell University and later completed a master's degree in emergency management at the University of Central Florida. Before joining Spectrum News 13, her broadcasting career took her to Maine, New York, Texas and Colorado. She has now spent more than a decade helping Central Florida residents understand hurricanes, tornadoes, lightning and the many other weather hazards that affect our region.

The evening was both educational and neighborly, combining professional expertise with a genuine connection to Tusawilla. We are fortunate to have someone with Maureen's experience living among us and willing to share her knowledge with fellow residents.

Our thanks to Maureen McCann for taking the time to help Tusawilla families prepare for the season ahead.
