



Maddie Maldonado (8th Grade), Club Member:


I like Garden Club because, well honestly, it's amazing! It has shown me a lot that I didn't know before, like how vegetables

Kenneth Collins (8th Grade), Club Member:



The **City of Winter Springs** is monitoring the COVID-19 (Coronavirus 2019) situation and following guidance from the CDC and the Florida Department of Health. The City is taking the following proactive and precautionary measures in response to the COVID-19 pandemic to prioritize the health and safety of our community and employees.

City Facilities & Programs

The **Winter Springs Senior Center and Therapy Pool are closed** and all programs and activities have been suspended <u>until further notice</u>.

Rentals of all City facilities, fields, and park pavilions are canceled <u>through April</u> 12.

<u>City parks will remain open at this time for general use</u>. Staff is taking additional sanitation measures to ensure playground equipment and restrooms are clean and disinfected. However, staff strongly recommends all users exercise extra caution when in any public area and continue to use elevated hygiene protocols.



All **City events, activities, and city-sponsored programs** are canceled <u>through April 12</u>. Cancellations include Explore Outdoors, league practices and games, recreation programs, and WSPD's ride-along program.

Utility and City Services

Utility Billing has **suspended disconnections for non-paying customers** in order to deliver essential services. For more information regarding payments and payment arrangements, contact Customer Service at 407-327-1800 or utilitybills@winterspringsfl.org.

The City has spoken with WastePro to ensure that collection services will continue.

The City's water and wastewater management partner, Veolia North America, has established a management team to monitor ongoing activities and accept

suggestions from national trade associations and government agencies. **Veolia staff will continue to operate the facilities in compliance with regulations including state required testing of water and wastewater.**

Police Update

The Winter Springs Police Department is fully operational and capable of handling situations that may occur. WSPD has established a unified command through the Department of Emergency Management, who is in contact with the Emergency Operations Center, Department of Health and the State Attorney's Office.

Calls for police services are being screened and officers will now take reports over the phone. If a face to face is required, officers will meet with the complainants in an open-air setting to reduce personal exposure and or physical contact.



Fingerprinting services have been suspended until further notice.

Human Resources

Employment services such as **interviewing and hiring** have been suspended <u>until</u> <u>further notice</u>. We are still accepting applications, but will not be interviewing.

Department directors have identified essential personnel that may be required to work from home prior to any operational closures.

Employees have been provided **educational material** and are encouraged to self-report and self-quarantine as needed. In addition, logistical arrangements have been made which include separating shared spaces, and **extreme sanitization protocols** are being executed across all departments.



IT Services

IT staff is monitoring VPN and security protocols to safeguard network operations and has created redundancies to continue City operations remotely as needed including dispatch and police services.

City Hall Lobby

Sanitizing protocols for Customer Services Representatives have been established to protect employees and the community. A **rigorous cleaning schedule** has been issued to sanitize counter tops, entry hardware in the morning, every 2-hours, and at end of day (60% alcohol hand sanitizer or bleach wipes).

Office of Emergency Management

Seminole County Emergency Operations Center is operating at a Level 2 while responding to COVID-19.

The County and its partners are closely monitoring the virus and have taken protective measures including: specialized training for employees, procurement of personal protective equipment for first responders, implementation of emergency response plans, and provision of community workshops to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

- Seminole County Emergency Management and Florida Department of Health-Seminole, personnel will be on hand to answer non-emergency questions related to COVID-19 and Seminole County's response
- The Citizens Information Hotline will be available Monday-Friday, 8:00am-5:00pm at 407-665-0000
- To receive text alerts from Seminole County Office of Emergency Management related to COVID-19, please text COVID19INFO to 888777 to opt in; standard text message rates apply.

Practicing personal health and hygiene actions are key in preventing the spread of respiratory viruses. Seminole County recommends following the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines:</u>

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, then discard the tissue.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick. If you are sick, stay home and practice "social distancing."

Seminole County is placing additional sanitizing stations in lobbies and entrances of the County's public-facing buildings, including but not limited to: library branches, the Civil and Criminal Courthouses, juror waiting areas, Environmental Services customer service offices, Building Division desks, and more. These locations will also undergo enhanced cleaning services by County contractors.


