

As you read through this issue, you will see photos of your Board members and neighbors volunteering at Dominick's restaurant to provide free hot lunches to the children of Winter Springs. The intent of the free lunches was to provide a much needed break to parents and children that were shut-in at home during "self isolation". The meals were also an alternative to the cold sandwiches being provided to families in need at our local schools. As the popularity of Dominick's lunch program took off, members of your THOA were on hand to provide much needed assistance in preparing and serving approximately 900 meals per day to the children in our area. ### MAIL THEFT



## **MEET ROMINA HOMAYOUN**

Romina Homayoun was born in Fairfax, Virginia and then moved to Maitland, where she attended the AAIM program in Dommerich Elementary School. She has lived in the same home in Tuskawilla since 6th grade, attending Indian Trails Middle School and then Oviedo High School. Romina lives with her mother and father and Maltese dog, Coco. She is an only child. Romina has wanted to be an Orthodontist since childhood but and is currently a published writer who also loves to write poetry. Some of her hobbies include playing piano, watching sports, reading all kinds of books, and collecting air plants. Please enjoy her inspiring story.

With great strength came great opposition, for me, by the name of Crohn's Disease. When I was diagnosed at the age of seven, my world changed, stopped spinning, and turned in the opposite direction. I grew up then, to an age that wasn't seven but wasn't an adult either. I was in-between, balancing on the tight rope above a precarious fall. While my life was anything but ordinary and my obstacles were anything but customary, I never let Crohn's make me feel out of place. I've learned life is too short, and it would become even shorter if I allowed the condition to overrule my life.

There is hardly any linguistic way I could properly describe this past decade of my life with Crohn's, how easily it has clutched my decisions in its hands, and how carelessly it has attempted to grab the steering wheel of my direction time after time. I have gone through three different biological medications via infusions, and in high school, I underwent nasogastric tube feeding each night. People may call me "strong"; I call it managing. People may say I was "brave"; I call it adapting. People are often surprised, claiming they could never guess I was going through something like that. I call that being a survivor.

There are 780,000 people living with Crohn's every day, and as far as anyone knows, there is no known cause and no actual treatment for this particular autoimmune condition that attacks the digestive system, only ways to alleviate symptoms. However, I have a theory for the best treatment, one that involves no prescription or negative side effects. There is something to be said about the power of love and support from a mother and father, and they played a humongous role in my iron-




clad strength. There is something more to be said about the resolve of a resilient soul.

With that being said, I became top of the class at of my high school, gained acceptance to several elite Ivy League universities, maintained a 4.0 GPA throughout












my undergraduate years at the University of Central Florida's Burnett Honors College, volunteer dental assisted at Grace Medical Home's Dental Center for over 200 hours, managed a volunteer organization in Maitland, and served as a mentor and teaching assistant for underclassmen through college orientation, Microbiology supplementary instruction, and various leadership courses. It was right about then I realized Crohn's Disease was not a source of pain, but actually a source of strength, knowledge, and motivation.

Along the way, I also discovered that Crohn's Disease has a link to dentistry, my dream career. I was disappointed to find there is little research regarding the connection between Crohn's and periodontal disease, so I readily took on the challenge. Through my Honors Undergraduate Thesis and the guidance of my professor and mentor, Dr. Samsam, I presented three projects in two years. Recently, we won first place at the Neuroscience Alliance Student Conference.

Now, why am I saying all of this? I'm not here to brag. I'm here to ask you a favor. I believe every single person has a life story filled with some sort of struggle, whatever that may be, and hopefully, the adversity is what makes us stronger. When faced with inexplicable difficulty, we have two choices: to let it destroy us or let it build us. I want you to know that it is never easy, but no one ever said it would be: please never be afraid to share your stories, wear your metaphorical scars of triumph, and show people who you are and what you have gone through.

Remember me like this: Crohn's has never defined me. I thought for so long I was defined by a condition that broke and rebuilt me. Then I came to understand my condition would not have to play a role in my life anymore.

I turned the page and took control of the narrative. Now it's your turn.







### **THOA FOOD DRIVE IS A HUGE SUCCESS!**

## THE MEDICAL CONCIERGE

Any of you remember when a doctor would come to your home and care for an ill family member? I do... and we now have the same wonderful service offered to our residents in Tuscawilla.

Susan Gentry, a resident of Tuscawilla worked as a triage nurse in the local Emergency Room in Ormond Beach Florida in 1980. She often knew there was a better way to take care of the many travelers who would come through her door to seek medical attention, in a non-familiar resort area.

After moving to Orlando in 1980, Susan continued to work long hours in our local Emergency Rooms with many of the Orlando tourists. Susan spoke to several of the ER physicians and said "Why don't we start a company that allows our medical team to go into Disney World hotels and see their guests who have become ill while on vacation instead of making them wait so long for minor illnesses"? All agreed and a new Way of delivering non-emergency medical care was born!!

The Medical Concierge service is now being offered for the first time to our Tuscawilla residents who would prefer a physician or a member of their extended medical team to make a house-call to their home or place of business 7 days a week. All Florida licensed physicians carry a full array of prescriptive medication that can be dispensed if indicated for your personal illness. Physicians can order X-rays, Nebulizer treatments and IV therapy for dehydration that can be provided in the comfort of your home. A medically coded statement is provided for possible insurance reimbursement.

Susan has loved living in Tuscawilla for the last 23 years and each time she has been asked what type of work she did, a community member would say "is that available for residents"? Now we can say ....It is!



### YOU MAY BE A TARGET, BUT YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE A VICTIM OF IDENTITY THEFT

- Check your credit. AnnualCreditReport.com 1-888-382-1222.
- Protect your Social Security Number. Only provide it when you MUST. As an alternative, provide only the last four digits.
- Shred sensitive docs. Shred unwanted credit card applications, cancelled checks, bank records, or any document containing personal information.
- Secure financial data. Before you disclose credit card or other financial account numbers on a website, make sure the site offers a secure or encrypted data transaction. Check for the icon of a lock in the browser window, and verify the URL changes from "http" to "https."
- Use strong passwords. A combination of 10 to 12 letters, numbers, and symbols. Don't use something guessable to someone who has information about you. Don't use the same password for multiple accounts.

- Ensure mail delivery.
  - Don't leave mail in your mailbox overnight. If you are travelling, notify the Post Office to have it held, or have a neighbor pick it up.
- "Know phishing."

Legitimate organizations never ask for your personal information through texts, pop-up messages, or email. Scammers may call and pretend to be from a government agency or business and try to get you to give them sensitive information - call back using a number you know to be legitimate.


