




# GUARDIAN AD LITEM "SECRET SANTA PROGRAM"

#### THE MONTH OF OCTOBER



# **MEET YOUR NEIGHBOR STUART MOORE**





Fishing is one of the great water activities that can be enjoyably spent with friends and family. Fishing allows anglers to relax and have some time to get away from the stressors of daily life. Did you know that there is a difference between a fishing pole and a fishing rod? A fishing pole comes from natural materials like bamboo. A fishing rod contains conventional composite substances including fiberglass, graphite, or Kevlar. Florida offers ample opportunities to participate in this sport so enjoy the content of this article that focuses on Mr. Stuart Moore's passion for making fishing rods.

Mr. Moore has lived in the Central Florida area since his family moved to Winter Park when he was a young child. He has had a passion for fishing since a young age. Stuart Moore and his wife Pat have three sons and will be celebrating their 50th wedding anniversary in January. They have been residents in the Tuscawilla Community for the past six years.

A neighbor and friend of Stuart contacted us in response to our continued efforts to highlight the hobbies and special interests of our residents in each issue of *Tuscawilla Today*. This led to an enlightening afternoon meeting where Mr. Moore explained his interest in making fishing rods and gaff hooks. As an avid angler, he frequently made repairs to his fishing gear. This led to regular trips to a special store in Oviedo known as "The Mud Hole".

As the time tolled, Stuart began to make his own fishing rods utilizing supplies from the Mud Hole and specialty items ordered online. Our conversation with Mr. Moore confirmed that he takes great joy in this hobby. Additionally, he donates several of his homemade fishing rods to generate charitable contributions for the "Kickoff for Kids" program.



This program benefits students in Central Florida Schools who receive free or reduced lunch, or families facing financial difficulties, by filling backpacks with food for the weekends.

Stuart patiently described the specialty tools used to create a fishing rod from the basic materials carefully organized in his work area inside the garage. As indicated with the pictures, there are numerous parts that must be adjusted and assembled for each rod and gaff hook. This art form requires an impressive amount of specialty thread with a wide variety of colors. Each component requires a special technique for attachment to the rod or gaff. During our visit, Mr. Moore demonstrated how the thread is carefully wound around the rod or gaff to create the beautiful designs and patterns represented in the pictures. The patience and skills associated with the construction of these items is impressive.

We were curious as to what his favorite locations for fishing were and what type of fish is most desirable. Without hesitation, Stuart replied that he and his son enjoy fishing in the Bahamas. Mr. Moore's son has a highly capable fishing boat in Palm Beach that transports them to the fishing grounds in a short period of time. Once they arrive, a combination of technology and Mother Nature are utilized to locate their favorite fish: Dolphin and Yellowfin tuna. Flocks of birds are indicators of bait fish near the surface of the water. When arriving at this location, the larger desirable fish are known to be attracted to the bait fish and can be caught (barring the desires of any sharks in the vicinity).

We appreciate Mr. Moore's willingness to share his hobby with us and even if you are not a fishing enthusiast, these amazing rods and gaffs are art forms to be admired. The number of hours devoted to creating these fishing rods and gaffs is evident in the detailed work with the finished products.








# **IN HONOR OF 9/11**

A combination of cranes, ladders, and mechanical knowhow have come together to produce a renovated splash pad that is certain to be a hit with the kids.

After living in the Tuscawilla Community for over 25 years, I continue to be amazed with the wildlife that continues to be observed in our neighborhoods.Past articles have discussed coyotes, red foxes and the variety of birds that visit our yards. Most recently, I had the unexpected pleasure of seeing two Pileated woodpeckers enjoying a meal of insects in our large oak tree.Past sightings have been rare and usually consisted of only one large bird "hammering" away for a meal.

While not uncommon, the Pileated woodpecker is the largest woodpecker in North America and, according the Audubon Society, excavates deep into rotten wood to get at nests of carpenter ants. They leave characteristic rectangular holes in dead trees as evidence of their search for food.

If you have an electric vehicle, check out the recently installed charging stations located in the Town Center and Central Winds Park. Charging procedures are located on the "Park & Plug" charging stations. Download the free GREENLOTS app, connect the charging cable and open the app, scan the QR code or enter the Station ID and start charging.

Additionally, the City has purchased two Chevrolet Bolt vehicles for use by the city staff. The Bolt wasn't the first electric car, but it was one of the first to offer a long range at an affordable price. The 2021 Bolt still fits that description with an

EPA-estimated 259 miles of range, a healthy number for a compact hatchback according to Chevrolet.

# THE THOA WILL BE HOSTING A MEETING TO REVIEW THE EMERGENCY SEWER PLANT PRIORITY REPAIRS AT SAM SMITH PARK IN TUSCAWILLA

The City has two wastewater plants, and both are 50 years old and in need of repair. One plant is located on the west side of town and the other is located here in Tuscawilla next to Sam Smith Park. The work at the plants include cleaning the debris out of the plants, installing screens, making metal repairs, installing new aeration equipment used in the treatment process, and structural repairs. Unfortunately, the age of the plants, combined with many years of neglect, have created this situation. The repairs are being done to keep the sewer plants operating while new plants are being designed, financed, and built.

In order to keep our residents informed with <u>accurate information</u> regarding the emergency repair work being conducted at the East Wastewater Treatment Plant, a meeting sponsored by the Tuscawilla Homeowner's Association will take place on **THURSDAY**, **OCTOBER 14**<sup>TH</sup> at the **Wedgewood Tennis Villas Clubhouse**. **The meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m.** and will consist of a complete review of the status of the plant, current necessary actions taking place to complete emergency repairs, and specific information on what the community can expect during this process. A comprehensive review of the long-term solution for replacing the plants will be presented. Residents will be able to ask questions of the engineers and wastewater experts who will be making the presentation. If you are interested in touring the plant site, arrangements will be made to schedule your visit.

Sewage treatment, while not an appealing topic, is a critical component of our infrastructure. The emergency repairs at the East side plant will take several months. The THOA wants to ensure that our members and residents have accurate information provided by professional engineers and water experts. Please plan to join us at the Wedgewood Tennis Villas Clubhouse on **Thursday**, **October 14**<sup>th</sup> **at 7:00**.



# IS IT TIME FOR A ROOF REPLACEMENT?

Many of our members have faced the question about when to replace a roof. There are no easy answers because depending upon the type of roofing material, brand, and style, the answer varies from around 15 years to sometimes 30 years. Throw in a few weather events and maintenance neglect and the answer could be 10 years.

#### THE MOST COMMON TYPES OF ROOFS

Overall, asphalt shingles are the most common but have the shortest lifespan of any roofing material. Within this category, the shingles with the shortest lifespan are the ones most commercial building companies used during the building boom of the late 90S and early 2000's. They are called 3-tab shingles. Even with proper maintenance, these shingles rarely last their advertised 20-year life expectancy due to the harsh Florida sun and heat, strong winds, and heavy rains. On average, a roof replacement for a 3-tab shingle is right around 12 to 15 years.

Another style of asphalt shingles is called Architectural Shingles. These shingles are heavier, more durable, and are often advertised as having a lifespan of 30 years. On average, however, most homeowners replace Architectural Shingles after about 15 – 20 years, also because of our severe Florida Climate.

## CONCERNING SIGNS OF NEEDING A ROOF REPLACEMENT

Please note that these are just guidelines. A reputable roofing company will tell you if you're wasting your money with repairs and should instead choose a roof replacement.

Some signs you need to consider:

- Curling and buckling shingles
- Missing shingles
- Visible granules in gutters after every rain
- Roof deck issues
- Age of roof

There are many resources available to research your options. Consider visiting sites such as www.AsktheBuilder.com and always interview at least 3 roofing companies for estimates.


