

WSPD Citizens Advisory Committee Notes:

A brief discussion regarding Code Enforcement was presented. Any code violations must be observed by either a Code Enforcement Officer or a WS Police Officer. Officers are NOT permitted to climb up on step ladders or other platforms to observe possible backyard violations. They must be able to see the violations from unobstructed vantage points. Typically, over 90% of the property owners comply with corrections when issued the first notice of code violation.

Captain Presley reviewed the recent robbery at the Speed Way service station. The two robbers are still at-large but the sense is that they will not return. One shot was fired accidentally when the robber jumped over the counter. No one was injured.

LOCK YOUR HOMES AND YOUR VEHICLES!!! Captain Presley stated that there is one individual who

lives in Oviedo but frequently wanders into the East end of the Tuscawilla Community to steal items out of unlocked cars. He is not aggressive and does not break into the cars. He checks door handles while looking for opportunities to enter vehicles in search of money for drugs. If you see someone who appears suspicious, CALL the WSPD.

If you see something, say something.

If you see something unusual, do not hesitate to notify the Police. If you feel uncomfortable about calling the police department, you can report suspicious activity anonymously. You don't have to give your name.
