#### **FLAG SIGNALS**

#### **BLUE - STEADY:**

Another competitor is close.

#### **BLUE - WAVED:**

Another competitor is trying to pass.

#### WHITE:

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

#### YELLOW - WAVED:

Danger, slow down sufficiently to ensure that full control of the vehicle can be retained. No overtaking.

#### **DOUBLE YELLOW - WAVED:**

Great danger. Slow down considerably. Be prepared to suddenly change from the projected racing line, or take other evasive action including stopping if necessary. No overtaking.

#### **YELLOW WITH RED STRIPES:**

Slippery surface ahead.

#### RED:

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals (at startline and marshals posts).

#### **GREEN - WAVED:**

All clear, at the end of a danger area controlled by yellow flags. Also used to signal the start of a formation lap and shown at all posts during first lap of each practice session and during the formation lap.

#### BLACK WITH ORANGE DISC DISPLAYED WITH WHITE NUMBER:

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver, call into pits immediately.

#### BLACK/WHITE WITH WHITE NUMBER:

Warning to driver that his behaviour (ie. corner cutting) is suspect and he may be black flagged.

#### **BLACK DISPLAYED WITH WHITE NUMBER:**

Driver must call in immediately to the pits and report to the Clerk of the Course.

#### **BLACK/WHITE CHEQUERED:**

End of race

Races are started when the Red start light is extinguished.

Welcome to the Isle of Anglesey and BARC North Western Centres annual trip to the seaside. Blessed with a top class programme of events to break the peace.



The British Superkart Racing Club competitors pay a welcome visit to the Island with their (in ascending order of speed) F125 Open, F250 Mono, F450 National and Division One classes. They are guaranteed to be fast and frantic. They can be seen in Races 1 and 4 on Saturday and races 6, 9 12 and 14 on Sunday.

Organised by the BARC North Western Centre the CNC Heads Sports / Saloon Car Championship is now

in it's 40th year. It's success very much down to an open rule book with space for anyone with a race car, provided that the car is based (however loosely) on a car originally designed for road use. The specials category is home to out and out racers, while the Modified category is cars closer to their road going roots. Each category is split into classes based on engine capacity,

which means everyone has someone to compete with. The overall champion is based on points gained within your class, add to that an "It's a Knockout" (there's one for the teenagers) style joker system and it all adds up to fun competitive racing and a grid full of interest and variety and can be seen in race 2 on Saturday and Sunday's races 8 & 15.

A group of teenagers in Citroen Saxos going around in circles as fast as they can. No it's not Saturday night in your local Sainbury's



car park (other supermarket car parks are available). It is in fact the Junior Saloon Car Championship. Open to 14 to 17 year olds it has become a valuable stepping stone for aspiring young drivers and can be seen in race 3 on Saturday and Races 7 & 13 on Sunday.

What do you get when you mix the 206 GTi Cup, Deutsche Marque Cup, Nippon Challenge,



Tricolore Trophy and TT Trophy together? Is great racing and a cost-effective way to get into motorsport, oh and it's called the Track Attack Race Club. They close proceedings with the last race on Saturday and race 13 on Sunday.

Providing less variety in machinery, but no less entertainment on track is the OT Publishing Coupe Cup with Toyo Tyres. Catering for first and second generation 2 litre Hyundai Coupes, all run to a standard specification with control parts, it is another ideal way to race on a

budget. They Qualify on Sunday for races 10 & 16.

Remember that the Paddock is open to all, so come into it and chat to the competitors, they are always ready to discuss their cars and exploits on the track.

# BSRC SUPER SERIES AND THE SUPER CUP FOR F450 NATIONAL AND F125 OPEN & KZ

The British Superkart Racing Club makes its annual visit to Anglesey for the continuation of its Super Series with five classes in action over the two days. The Division 1 and F250 Mono classes started their season at Cadwell Park in April, while the F450 National, F125 Open and 125 KZ L/C will begin their campaign at Trac Mon. The latter three classes will also be competing for a Super Cup on Sunday. Competition for top honours will be fierce so who are the key drivers to look out for?

Heading the points in the Division 1 category after a maximum score at Cadwell Park is defending



Super Series champion Matt Robinson. However, he will be on a different island over the weekend having decided to head north by 64 miles to the Isle of Man to watch bikes flash past at 200mph in the TT races. That opens the way for Carl Hulme, lying second in the standings after a second place and two fourths at Cadwell, to close the gap of 25 points with 90 points at his disposal.

Jack Tritton, who won the Motorsport UK British

Superkart Championship and the Super Series in the F125 Open class in 2022 has made a great start to his rookie Division 1 year. He holds third place in the points only five behind Hulme with his Harvey prepared VM.

A driver that could be heading for victory is Liam Morley, the 2020 BSRC Club champion and Grand Prix winner at Donington Park last September. Liam's 2023 Super Series campaign started with a second place behind Robinson, but a crash while lapping a backmarker and subsequent non-start has left him down in 10<sup>th</sup> place in the standings. He picked up five wins at Trac Mon in 2022 so will be the man that the rest are trying to beat.

Other drivers that should be in contention are Ross Allen, Andy Gulliford, Carl Kinsey Tom Rushforth and Sam Moss. Unfortunately, Motorsport UK British Champion Lee Harpham isn't among them as he is away in Cyprus for a family wedding.

Lee Plain was the man to beat in the F250 Mono class last year and racked up six wins as he retained the BSRC Super Series and his Motorsport UK British Superkart Championship title with a maximum score. However, at the Cadwell Park opener in 2023 he retired with a broken gear level before picking up two second places. As a consequence, he is down in fifth spot in the points table.



Leading the way is five-time MSA British Superkart Champion Paul Platt who racked up a maximum score with three wins at Cadwell. A new aerodynamic design at the rear of the PVP chassis has appeared this year and Paul is delighted with the performance. The battle between Platt and Plain is eagerly anticipated.

Parker Motorsport drivers Tom Hatfield and Shaun Lombardo finished in third and fourth in the Super Series last year and are currently

second and fourth sandwiching Grand Prix winner Kirk Cattermole and separated by 15 points. All three drivers will be out to give Platt and Plain a hard time, which makes the podium places very crowded. Bennett's Superkart Scholarship winners Samantha Hempshall and Luke Clemson should also feature strongly.

The F450 National class should see an interesting contest. Kevin Ridley, the designer and manufacturer of the Silverstone chassis is having a rare outing. Wins at Oulton Park last October could be repeated this weekend. However, he will have opposition from reigning Super Series

champion Nick Flint. Add in Ronan McClintock and the new 'Queen' of Cadwell Ami Jerger who both had wins last year and we could see some close racing.

Shane Stoney, Grand Prix winner in 2022, heads the F125 Open class. He picked up five wins in the Super Series last year and should be on the top of the podium again. Out to beat him will be Tom Riley, the 2021 MSUK British Champion and recent winner of the King of Cadwell.



Making their long circuit debuts are Aston Baker, Ian Smith and Ella Stevens. The latter pairing in the KZ L/C class. Ella recently won the British Championship Short Circuit meeting at Kimbolton so will be out to impress in Anglesey.

The action all weekend is expected to be close. Who will emerge through the Corkscrew and out of the final corner to take the class wins?

The championship is run by the BARC NW Centre and equally amazing is the fact that John Leck the Championship Co-ordinator has run it for all of the 40 years! Ric Wood has been sponsoring the championship for 16 years, amazing! and we are massively grateful for his loyalty. You probably know that Ric is no mean racing driver himself. He usually puts in an appearance in the championship every now and then

in one of his phenomenally quick cars so hope that he is here when you are!

After all the chaos caused by the pandemic, registrations have been building up again to healthy numbers and there are several new drivers and cars this season, so we look forward to them making their mark in the racing against the returning regulars. Trac Mon has been a favourite of the drivers, and this is the first of 2 visits this season. This meeting sees the return to a full grid with at the time of writing the possibility of even having reserves. This is probably due to the committee understanding the financial issues this year and reducing the costs of competing by cutting the number of meetings (but retaining the 14 rounds) and slashing the entry fee to £400.

The first 2 rounds were run at Cadwell Park in April and got the season off to a good start with some great racing. Andy Southcott flew off into the distance both times and won overall and class A in his Midget with familiar faces taking the other classes. With 3 races this weekend we will see how the points stack up.

Just to remind you, the championship contains two major categories with classes A, B and C being Silhouette Specials where just about any amount of modification of the cars is allowed. The body shape does not mean that the engine came from that model of car or even that it is in the same place as the original! Classes D, E and F are Modified where the cars must retain the original production body shell and engine type.



The classes of both categories are divided by engine size with A and D above 2500cc, B and E 1600cc to 2500cc and C and F up to 1600cc.

This season we have introduced a new class G for all bike engine cars of any category. Those up to 1450cc have a minimum weight of 450kgs, those above 1450cc must weigh at least 500kgs.
