M: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Silence for reflection and self-examination.

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Welcome! You are invited to worship with us in the quiet of prayer, the joy of music, and the sharing of the Word. We gather at the Lord's table today. He is the host—we are the guests. Here He nourishes us with food and drink and the full assurance of our salvation in Him.

The Eucharist Words of Consecration

M: In the night in which he was betrayed, Our Lord took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

M: Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

M: With this Bread and cup, we remember our Lord's Passover from death to life.

C: "Christ has Died, Christ has Risen, Christ will Come Again, Amen"

The Lord's Prayer

M: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray with confidence in the Words our Lord and Saviour taught us.

C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen

M: Come to the Lord's Table, All are Welcome, here our guests become our friends', and our friends become our family.

C: We confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of Your holy name. Amen

M: Almighty God, who is rich in mercy, loves you completely and unconditionally, and grants you forgiveness for all of your sins. By His grace and mercy and your faith in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven, and salvation is yours. May the Holy Spirit guide you forward in His love and forgiveness.
