ABOUT US





Power Hour

Power Hour helps Club youth achieve academic success with homework help and enrichment activities, and by encouraging them to become life-long, self-directed learners.

In 2023, 45% of our youth participated in Power Hour.





Summer Brain Gain

Summer Brain Gain offers fun, handson activities that inspire creativity and critical thinking to help kids return to school ready to succeed.

In 2023, 361 youth participated in the Summer Brain Gain program.

DIY STEM

DIY STEM is a hands-on, activity-based STEM program that connects youth ages 9-12 to science themes they encounter regularly.

 Clubs of America.


WORK READY PLUS



Work Ready Plus is a specialty program at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Dumplin Valley which focuses on providing workforce development programming to teens. Through participation in the program, teens complete the Work Ready Plus Academy where they learn traits of professionalism, resume building, interviewing skills, and more. Following the Work Ready Plus Academy, youth are offered paid internships in Club sites or the local community to gain on the job experience.

In 2023...

- 85 teens completed the Work
 Ready Plus Academy. Work Ready
 Plus Academy teaches youth
 workplace preparation through the
 Career Launch and Money Matters
 program curriculums.
- 85 teens completed Work Ready
 Plus paid 60-120 hour internships.
- 19 teens participated in Work Ready Plus field trips to local colleges and universities.




