

Rules 13-16

Getting students to remember:

- 13. Allow time for short-term memory to function
- 14. Retention help the recall
- Facilitate in the storage and retrieval process
- 16. Techniques to use for longterm memory recall



Rules 1-5

Getting students attention:

- 1. Get their attention
- Tell students what to focus attention on
- 3. Don't overload the system
- Slow down, regain attention when necessary
- Don't try to compete with distractions

Rules 6-12

Increase information processing as intended:

- 6. Recognize student interpretation (perception)
- 7. Present material in a structured way
- 8. Present information in context (how can it be used)
- 9. Help students with meaning making
- 10. Build upon prior knowledge
- 11. Use visuals and images to aid in memory
- Devise ways to ensure students are actively involved.
