

Renee Heitmann is a critically acclaimed soprano, hailed for her "clear, beautiful, angelic" sound, dramatic delivery, and ability to breathe life into the roles she takes on. She is a frequent guest of the Mid-Columbia Symphony and Mid-Columbia Mastersingers, most recently appearing in the Yakima region with a reprisal of the role of Anne Frank in James Whitbourn's *Annelies*, a harrowing cantata based on text from Anne's diary. She has been teaching voice privately in New York City since 2011 and has now taken her practice completely online. She has had the pleasure of artistic directing and conducting a number of choirs, finding extra joy working with seniors and the differently-abled. Renee also writes, directs, and produces musical revues, including her (almost) one woman show, *Welcome to New York*.

Renee would like to thank the Mid-Columbia Mastersingers for the opportunity to continue creating music and theatre in the midst of a pandemic where live performances are put on hold. She is very much looking forward to the day when everyone can sing in person again.

Renee holds a master of music degree from Temple University in Philadelphia, and a bachelor of music from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey. JEREMY IRLAND, AENEAS



Jeremy Irland, whose voice has been praised as having "a beautifully rich consistency and clarity," is an avid performer and recitalist. Mr. Irland has appeared with the Seattle Symphony as Bobby in Weill's *Mahagonny* Songspiel, Wotan in ViVace's production of *Das Rheingold*, Leporello in Washington Idaho Symphony's production of *Don Giovanni*, the Dutchman with the Cleveland Wagner Institute's *Der Fliegende Holländer*, Assan in Menotti's *The Consul* at New England Conservatory, Morales and Zuniga in Bizet's *Carmen*, Presto in Poulenc's *Les Mamelles de Tirésias* with Vespertine Opera, Nardo in Mozart's *La Finta Giardiniera*, the Mother in Weill's *Seven Deadly Sins*, Doctor Bartolo in Mozart's *Le Nozze di Figaro* with UW Opera, and dual world premières of Michael Valenti's one-act operas *Beau Nash* and *Story of an Hour* with both the Portland Chamber Symphony and the Walla Walla Symphony.

Equally involved with orchestral and concert work, Mr. Irland has performed Paul Basler's *Cantos Alegres*, Nils Lindberg's *Christmas Cantata*, and Carl Orff's *Carmina Burana* with the Mid Columbia Mastersingers. With the Walla University Wind Symphony he was the bass soloist in Copland's *Old American Songs*. Mr. Irland has several popular oratorios under his belt, including the Mozart, Brahms, Verdi, and Faure *Requiems*, as well as the Rossini *Stabat Mater*.

Mr. Irland has studied with Jane Eaglen, Carol Vaness, and Dr. Matthew James. Mr. Irland also holds degrees from Walla Walla University (BM in music education) and the University of Washington (MM in vocal performance). He is currently quite happy to be working as an elementary music teacher in Moses Lake.

MOLLY HOLLERAN, BELINDA



Molly Holleran performs frequently throughout the Pacific Northwest as a concert soloist, as well as appearing in opera and musical theatre. She most recently performed Strauss' Four Last Songs with the Mid-Columbia Symphony, and sang the title role in the West Coast premiere of Melissa Dunphy's Gonzalez Cantata. Favorite solo concert performances have included Handel's Messiah with the Oregon East Symphony and Walla Walla Symphony; Poulenc's Gloria, Verdi's Requiem, and Orff's Carmina Burana with the Mid-Columbia Symphony; and Beethoven's Symphony No. 9 with Washington-Idaho Symphony. Molly sang the premiere performance of Reginald Unterseher's Hanford Songs song cycle for soprano and string quartet. Favorite opera roles include Queen of the Night (Die Zauberflöte) and Cunegonda (Candide), and local audiences may have seen her perform with Mid-Columbia Musical Theatre as Marian in The Music Man, Maria in The Sound of Music, and Cinderella in Into the Woods. As a professional chorister, Molly was a founding member of both the

Chicago Chamber Choir and the Tucson Chamber Artists, now known as True Concord, and has sung with the chorus of the Oregon Bach Festival.

Molly holds undergraduate degrees in voice and theatre from Lawrence University in Wisconsin, and a master's degree in voice from the University of Arizona. In addition to performing, she runs a full-time independent voice studio in Richland, WA, and also enjoys doing graphic design work for arts oganizations, including the Mid-Columbia Mastersingers.

RACHEL CONDIE, SECOND WOMAN



Rachel Condie has performed with the choruses of the Utah Symphony & Opera, the Toledo Opera, the Opera Grand Rapids, the Operafestival di Roma, and the Michigan State University Choral Union in well-known works such as Mozart's *Requiem*; Orff's *Carmina Burana*; Beethoven's *9th Symphony*; Duruflé's *Requiem*; Puccini's *Madame Butterfty, La Bohème, Suor Angelica*, and *Turandot*; Verdi's *Macbeth* and La *Traviata*; Mozart's *Le Nozze di Figaro*; and Bizet's *Carmen*.

As a soloist, Rachel has sung the roles of Suor Dolcina in Puccini's *Suor Angelica* (Operafestival di Roma), Senator Chuck Grassley in Melissa Dunphy's *Gonzales Cantata* (Mid-Columbia Mastersingers), and the Damsel in Rob Gardner's *The Lamb of God*.

Rachel's love of the arts extends beyond performing. She has been the Patron Relations Coordinator for the Walla Walla Symphony since she moved to Walla Walla in 2015. Prior to that, she worked as the Patron Services Manager and Development Assistant for the Toledo Opera and the Administrative Assistant for the Michigan Humanities Council.

Rachel is a native of DeWitt, Michigan. She holds a bachelor of musical arts degree in voice performance with a minor in German from Brigham Young University-Idaho (2006) and a master of arts degree in arts administration from University of Michigan-Flint. (2012).

ADRIENNE FLETCHER, SORCERESS



Adrienne Fletcher currently serves as the Music Director of the Mid-Columbia Youth Symphony Orchestras and the Assistant Conductor of the Mid-Columbia Symphony. She is a staff pianist for the Mid-Columbia Mastersingers Youth Choirs and the Resident Music Director and Office Specialist at the Academy of Children's Theatre. Fletcher has previously served as Assistant Conductor for Wenatchee Valley Symphony Orchestra, Guest Conductor for Yakima Youth Symphony Orchestra, Assistant Conductor for Central Washington University Symphony Orchestra and Opera Production, and Guest Conductor for the Kittitas Valley Youth Orchestra. She has been a Music Director and a vocal coach for Valley Musical Theatre, Warehouse Theatre, Ellensburg High School, and Central Washington University's Opera Workshop.

Fletcher remains active as a performing musician. As a harpist, she has played with several ensembles including Olympia Symphony, Tacoma Concert Band, and Tacoma Opera. She works frequently as a vocal coach and collaborative pianist in the Tri-Cities and surrounding area, and has also been seen on stage as a singer and actor throughout the region. Recent credits include Lucy Van Pelt in *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown* and Sarah Brown in *Guys and Dolls* with Valley Musical Theatre, Alice Beineke in *The Addams Family* with Warehouse Theatre, and The Queen of the Night in *The Magic Flute* with CWU Opera Workshop.

Fletcher holds a master of music degree in orchestral conducting and vocal performance/pedagogy from Central Washington University and a bachelor of musical arts degree in harp performance from Pacific Lutheran University. A native of Forest Grove, Oregon, Adrienne Fletcher currently resides in Richland, Washington with her two cats, Sadie and Optimus.

KELLY NOELLE PARKS, WITCHES



Tri-Cities' own Kelly Noelle Parks received rigorous performance training from Columbia Basin College, earned a bachelor of music degree in vocal jazz performance at Seattle's Cornish College of the Arts, and is a Graduate of Eastern Washington University, earning a master's degree in music and teacher certification. While at Eastern, she was involved in all four choirs, directing a beginning vocal jazz class, as well as studied classical voice with Spokane's Susan Windham.

Her performance experience is broad in both classical and jazz realms. She has studied and performed classically with Tri-Cities' own Carissa Simpson and performed jazz at various wineries. While in Seattle, she took part in many jazz jam sessions throughout the city and within Cornish College of the Arts, mingling with working musicians. This has given Kelly hands-on experience in performing with other professionals

in "on-the-spot" situations that is part of the true tradition of a jazz experience. While studying at Eastern Washington University, she performed in two mass choir performances with the Spokane Symphony Chorale at the Fox Theatre, including Verdi's *Requiem*, and Vaughan Williams' *Serenade to Music*. Kelly was also accepted to participate in a master class with famed American opera singer Thomas Hampson, from whom she received invaluable training.


Bios

Arlo McGowan has performed with the Mastersingers many times, making his debut in *The Little Sweep* in 2018. As a professional singer, he performs with the Oregon Bach Festival, True Concord Voices and Orchestra, Male Ensemble Northwest and Chor Anno. He has served as an adjudicator for festivals and competitions throughout the Northwest, and regularly visits local music classes and choirs as a visiting artist.

Throughout his career, Justin has received numerous awards and recognition for his efforts to give the arts a place of prominence in his community. 


