



JASON ROSE, CLARINET

Jason Rose received a bachelor's degree in music education from Central Washington University in 2003. While there, he studied clarinet with Joseph Brooks, and performed in the renowned CWU Symphonic Winds under the direction of Larry Gookin, in the University Orchestra with Dr. Paul-Eliott Cobbs, and in jazz bands under the direction of Tom Gause and Kristin Korb. Jason has taught high school and middle school band and orchestra in Kennewick and Richland, and has been teaching at Richland High School since 2008. Jason earned his National Board Certification in 2012 in the area of Music: Early Adolescence through Young Adulthood. Currently in the process of earning his master's degree in music education, he is preparing a thesis on the topic of teaching the STEM subjects in a high school instrumental music class. Jason is the principal clarinetist of the Mid Columbia Symphony, and a member of a saxophone quartet that is made up of Richland School District music teachers. When not teaching students or playing music, Jason can be found cycling around the Tri-Cities, hiking and camping around the Northwest with Carri and their two dogs, or adding to his burgeoning collection of passport stamps.

CARRI ROSE, PERCUSSION

Carri Rose earned a bachelor's degree in music education from Central Washington University in 2004, where she studied percussion with Andrew Spencer and Mark Gooenberger, and performed in a wide variety of music ensembles. Carri began her teaching career in the fall of 2004 in Othello, teaching 7-12 instrumental music. In 2006, she relocated to the Tri-Cities, and began teaching general music, band, orchestra, and choir at Lewis and Clark Elementary in Richland. She earned her National Board Certification in Early and Middle Childhood Music in 2011 and received a graduate degree in music education through the University of Idaho in 2013. Carri has presented at multiple conferences for music educators, including the 2015 National Association of Music Educators Northwest Music Educators' Conference. Currently, Carri is in her 10th year of teaching music at Lewis and Clark Elementary, and she performs regularly with the Mid-Columbia Symphony and the Mid-Columbia Mastersingers.
